As you begin this devotional, wherever you may start to read, make Jesus your way, make Him your truth, and make Him your life.



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
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Dear Reader,

The devotional you now hold in your hand was 22 years in the making. Or, perhaps, the real fact of the matter is that *I* was in the making for 22 years in order to be able to bring this devotional to you.

In 1979, I observed in the life of a friend a devotional practice that seemed unusual to me. Every day, my friend would walk into an open field across the parking lot from her office. There she would sit down on a rock to pray and write in what appeared to be a notebook or journal. After several weeks of watching this odd ritual, I wondered, What is she writing down? Finally, when the opportunity presented itself, I asked her and she said, "Oh, I'm just writing down what I hear the Spirit of God speak to my heart while I pray."

God speaks to people? I thought.

The concept left me both baffled and intrigued. I determined right then and there that I was going to start taking pen and paper into my times of prayer and devotion. I wanted to know if God would show up and speak to me, too. What I discovered was that not only did God show up to speak to me, but He had been there, waiting for me to listen, all along.

Not long after that, I heard a minister make a statement that marked me indelibly. His words forever altered the way I would both approach and present the Word of God from that day forward. Before he delivered his message, this man prayed, "Father, don't let the people just hear what I'm saying. Let them hear what You are saying to them about what I'm saying." Instantly, I recognized the distinction.

I realized that although every person present in the room that day would hear the



minister speak the same identical words, the Spirit of God would reveal and emphasize various truths in unique ways to each one of us, based upon our own individual needs and levels of understanding. That realization—coupled with my newly developed practice of writing down what God would speak to my heart by His Spirit and through His Word—transformed my life completely. It also gently propelled me into a degree of fellowship and intimacy with the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit that I never dreamed was possible for me to enjoy.

The purpose of this devotional is not only to share the fruit of those times of fellowship with you, but also to let you know that the same intimacy with God is available to you as well. You *can* hear the voice of the Spirit of God. But, first, you must recognize that He does indeed want to speak to you. And He will!

During His earthly ministry, Jesus—the Son of the Living God, the Word of God made flesh—said, "The words that I speak unto you, they are spirit and they are life" (John 6:63). Jesus also said that the words He spoke were not His own—meaning that they did not originate from His own intellect. Rather, they were inspired words, words given to Him by the Father. That lets us know two things: Whatever the Father speaks to us individually will be consistent with what He has spoken to His people collectively, and whatever words He speaks to our hearts personally will be just as Spirit-

born and life-giving as His words that are written in the Scriptures.

Furthermore, we find that not only do we experience comfort, correction, and instruction in what God speaks and illuminates to us personally, but we also discover key elements of His great and unique design for our individual lives.


To know one's individual purpose is the ultimate insight from God. It is divine insight or spiritual revelation which flesh and blood cannot make known to you. Divine insight is beyond the reservoirs of man's intellect. But it is not difficult to tap. Psalm 119:92 (NKJV)—Unless Your law had been my delight, I would have perished in my affliction.

I am grateful God did not allow me to be satisfied with anything apart from Him. I enjoy many wonderful things but there is nothing I am so attached to that I cannot walk away from it. I feel the same way about people. I experience some wonderful relationships, but because of my love for Jesus I don't expect to miss a step in my walk with the Lord whether another person is present or absent in my life.

Enjoy everything you have as well as the people you know. Love Jesus more than anything or anyone and you will wake up every day happy or, at the least, content.

Whatever it is that you think will make you happy does not come close to what the Lord has for you when you seek Him first, His kingdom and His righteousness. His Word equips you to be happy and successful.

Demolished Theories and Barriers

2 Corinthians 10:5 (KJV)—Casting down imaginations and every high thing that exalteth itself against the knowledge of God and bringing into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ.

ost of us have runaway minds. I find I have to put the brakes on my thoughts because my mind sometimes acts like it is not my friend; worse, sometimes it appears to want to get me killed.

Watch wanting to speculate when the word is very clear for you to obey. Speculation, for a believer, is an assignment to cause you not to trust God, the only one you can trust. It has to be destroyed. It is our enemy.

Imaginations are nothing more than theories and arguments hoping that you will give them power to control. You and I have the ability to cast them down; without our cooperation, they have no life of their own.

Conceit and pride are imaginations that will take over if you fail to stay humble. Humility is when you have more than you ever dreamed you could have and understand that your skills, talents, and gifts come from God. It tells everyone that all that you are, have, and do is because God loves you.

One of the best ways I have learned to bring my thinking into captivity is to obey 1 Peter 2:23 and 1 Peter 4:19 which teach us to commit ourselves to the One who judges right. I give my soulish area over to the Lord, the same way I gave Him access to my spirit for the purpose of salvation:

- 1. I make a choice to do it.
- 2. I operate my tongue and vocal cords to confess my choice.
- 3. I believe that it was a done deal with the Lord.
- 4. I act like it is so.

Thoughts come up occasionally that are looking for space in which to breed. The only ground or place they can grow is in the human mind. You may not prevent their arrival, but you certainly don't have to entertain them or treat them as a welcome guest.

Don't Put Your Value On It

Deuteronomy 7:25 (NKJV)—You shall burn the carved images of their gods with fire; you shall not covet the silver or gold that is on them, nor take it for yourself, lest you be snared by it; for it is an abomination to the Lord your God.

hat brings back memories. When Clinton and I first married we purchased a six-foot diameter zodiac for our home. It covered an entire wall.

God began to introduce truth to us and, because of the truth, we put the zodiac out for the sanitation hauler to remove. I heard in my spirit, "Borrow your neighbor's pick ax and chop up the zodiac into small pieces so that no one will be able to take it home as an innocent ornament. It carries with it the spirit of what it represents."

My first reaction was, "We paid several hundred dollars for that piece, why destroy it?" It was my spirit man that said, "It's not good for your house. You would not want someone else to innocently take that spirit into his home, would you?" That settled it; my husband and I destroyed the piece.

Our marriage had struggled for the first three years then, suddenly, it began to turn around when we removed that piece from our home and destroyed it. What we considered an innocent ornament was a snare to us, and our marriage was negatively affected by it.

Are you innocently wearing anything that God could consider an abomination? It matters not how much it cost, get rid of it. It is hindering your progress spiritually.

Many people bring home as souvenirs figurines, statues, or masks, without realizing what they are releasing into their homes. No amount of prayer, fasting, or therapy will help until that abomination is out of your house.

After destroying that costly piece, we asked for God's forgiveness. Then we asked Him to show us anything in our home that He considered an abomination. We burned more books and destroyed more record albums than you can imagine.

I know to pray and do what the Word says regardless of cost. Do you?

Equal Rights For Women

Numbers 27:4 (NKJV)—"Why should the name of our father be removed from among his family because he had no son? Give us a possession among our father's brothers."

ren't you glad that Jesus freed us from what was almost considered a curse?

For a man not to father a son in the Old Testament was not received well. The only thing worse than not fathering a son in the eyes of that society was being barren as a wife.

This was the first pre-nuptial agreement. The daughters of Zelophehad petitioned to receive an inheritance for their father's name so he would not be penalized for not having sons. They did not protest to the other women. They believed God would do the right thing and would speak through his servant in charge. He did; and they received from God what they requested.

However, the daughters had to agree to certain guidelines if they wanted the money. For female heirs to marry, what they owned

was protected from being absorbed into the inheritance of another tribe. They could have given up their inheritance to marry outside the tribe but that was not likely since they risked asking for it in the first place.

Ladies, your equal rights must be found in Jesus.

We have a friend who put all her eggs, which were many, into a basket with her husband's. He stopped doing things God's way and a divorce, which she did not want, occurred. He did not behave like a man of God towards her and she ended up with only her integrity and love for Jesus.

She did not embarrass him. She trusted God to work all things together for her good because she understood that her inheritance was not in this world. Because he did not do right by her or God, he lost everything including what was once a lucrative career. She never lost her desire to serve God and others. Now God is remembering what He originally planned for her.

Ladies, your equal rights must be found in Jesus. Your access to Him makes you not only equal but ahead of many. Keep your focus on what and who makes you equal.

Evil Must Be Your History, Not Your Future

Psalm 37:27 (NKJV)—Depart from evil and do good; and dwell forevermore.

'm amazed and saddened by the number of Christians who want God to deliver them from things He has already told them to quit.

Notice it says, "Depart from evil." Nowhere does that imply that God is going to remove evil from your path nor is He going to eradicate evil so you won't sin. As a matter of fact, sin is allowed to run its course so that your resistance to the wicked one will prove that the greater power lives within you. Paul wrote that when you are tempted, God would make a way of escape (1 Corinthians 10:13).

Psalm 37:28 says, "For the Lord loves justice and does not for-

sake His saints; they are preserved forever, but the descendants of the wicked shall be cut off."

It does not get any clearer than that. As His child I will never be abandoned or allowed to deteriorate. The children of the devil shall be cut off from God's protection and preservation.

God can do anything, but years have taught me that He will not do for me what He has authorized me to do for myself. As a matter of fact, He usually will not make another move on my behalf until I perform what was my part in my life.

When we have departed from evil and do good, I can assure you that when it is God's turn to move on your behalf, He will attempt to wipe out all of the devil's assignment against you if you prayed according to His wisdom and His Word.

It is never too late to get it together. I thank God I do not have to bring my history into my present because He gave me a future in His Son that has no remembrance of my past. That's good news.

Hear and Learn

Deuteronomy 31:12 (NKJV)—Gather the people together, men and women and the little ones, and the stranger who is within your gates, that they may hear and that they may learn to fear the Lord your God and carefully observe all the words of this law.

ne of the last duties Moses performed was to command the people to hear and learn what the Lord inspired him to write and to teach. Learning should result from hearing. Often, it is not the case.

Many people listen so they can be selective in obeying what has been taught. Though we are not under the law, the liberty we enjoy because of God's grace does not eliminate the principles in His Word or His voice speaking a specific thing to our hearts to do.

Fornication and adultery throughout the Bible are forbidden. Yet, some Christians still participate in them, and have nerve enough to tell you, "The Lord knows their heart."

We recently were impressed to check on our Ministers of Helps' tithing because it is church policy that all workers, staff, Ministers of Helps, and leadership tithe. Membership in RLCC does not require you to tithe, but serving does.

When the printout was given to me, we knew that some were serving in disobedience. A general letter was sent asking all to correct their disobedience or resign their positions until they agreed to adhere to church policy.

A few came forward to explain their situation. A few agreed to sit down until their faith and finances flowed together.

I asked several, point blank, "Are you tithing?" You would not believe the answers I received. How do you tithe "occasionally"? What happened to the fear or reverence for the Lord?

We know what we have taught. We also know what you vowed to do. Based on the actions of some people, they listened but did not learn.

There is a difference between hearing and listening. Hearing results in learning; when you only listen, it's placed beside what you want and choose to do.

Thank God for His mercy and His grace. Just don't frustrate them.

Acts 4:16 (NKJV)—"What shall we do to these men? For, indeed, that a notable miracle has been done through them is evident to all who dwell in Jerusalem and we cannot deny it."

any people ask, "What happened to the miracles of the Bible?" I say God got tired of performing them since they seem to have little or no affect on people to better serve and obey Him.

God has performed some notable miracles through me. Deaf ears could hear where the eardrum had been removed. Barren women have given birth several times. Cancer was cursed in the body of some who were mere skin and bones. Short legs and arms have grown out.

Where are the recipients of these miracles? I only know that they are not at RLCC or, in some instances, any other assembly.

What does excite me is the number of people in our church who seldom come forward to ask for a miracle but give praise reports about miracles accomplished by applying what they have been taught at RLCC and approaching God's throne for themselves or loved ones in need.

A miracle can be like money, it will motivate only for a while. Then the question becomes, "What have you done for me lately?" People who get their needs met because of the message, and not a miracle, keep it.

Apostles, evangelists, prophets, pastors, teachers, and any untitled believer can do miracles in His name. More importantly, they teach others that they can have miracles themselves or perform miracles for others in His name.

That is the greatest miracle of all. To impart truth from His gospel to the educated and the uneducated, the rich and the poor, the black and the white, and any other category you can think of and watch them run with it.

Teach it and preach it because of its power. But please do not become disillusioned or dejected when the miracles at your hand do not motivate right choices.

The miracle for you is to remain faithful in what you are called to do.

which was to get him set free. Sometimes it appears better to eliminate a problem than to deal with it. Yes, it was important to get the sincere ones saved, but to God it was just as important to get that man delivered. I learned a great spiritual lesson in this.

Later, I was told that others in the congregation knew of this man, who referred to himself as Prophet So and So. There were eyewitnesses to the fact that when he opened his brief case to reach for his Bible, he moved his fifth of liquor aside.

Strong substance had led him astray because it was pretty clear that he once had known Christ.

I pray the Lord will send him across my path again so that instead of dismissing him and leaving him to the demons of strong drink, I can use the authority and power to go and really preach and live truth to others.

Surprise, Surprise, Surprise

Psalm 52:7 (NKJV)—Here is the man who did not make God his strength, but trusted in the abundance of his riches, and strengthened himself in his wickedness.

ost of us know or have read about men and women who make the society page or headlines and fit this verse. I certainly do not envy them because of what they can buy or places they can visit.

Aboard a luxury cruise ship recently the captain announced at the last port of call that we could not dock where he had intended and everyone was going to have to take a tender to shore. You could feel the anger and disappointment among the passengers as though he had said no one would be able to go ashore at all.

I thought, "That's so sad." The joy of the vacation for us was not the opportunity to make purchases, but the opportunity to read and write without disturbance, and, most of all, the excitement of leading a shoe salesperson and our cabin steward in the prayer of salvation. We also rested our bodies and waited for God to set up opportunities to tell others about Jesus.

It is not just surprising to those who have amassed wealth that their trust cannot be placed in it; it is also frightening. The tragedy is some of those who trust their riches and no longer are using their faith for daily bread are Christians. They tapped into the principles of prosperity but forgot that it is God who gives them the power to get wealth. (See Deuteronomy 8:18.)

Can you say today, "But I am like a green olive tree in the house of God. ... I will praise You forever, because You have done it; and in the presence of Your saints I will wait on Your name, for it is good" (Psalm 52:8-9, NKJV).

When we acknowledge God as our source of supply and abundance and wait in His name, we are saying, "God, You have a good reputation and You have never made a mistake or been wrong about anything." How can we not trust Him?

Then I Want Out of Here

Psalm 71:18 (NKJV)—Now also when I am old and gray-headed, O God, do not forsake me, until I declare Your strength to this generation, Your power to everyone who is to come.

ive to ten minutes after midnight as the date ushered in my 67th birthday while doing the live call-in talk show, "The Choice Is Yours," "Crystal" called in crying and wanted to be saved. Needless to say, I immediately led her in a prayer to receive Jesus Christ as her Savior.

What a birthday gift from the Lord! I received some beautiful, costly gifts for my special day but none compared to being used of God to lead a soul to Jesus Christ.

It was near 5:00 a.m. before I drifted off to sleep. My thoughts were of how valuable we are to God and what we consider valuable. In a dream or vision, I saw myself offering a boiled egg to anyone willing to pay five dollars for it. Of course, there were no takers. Along came a man who had not had any food for several days. He was willing to pay the five dollars, in fact, he was willing

to offer me whatever he had because what he had could not satisfy his hunger and need for food. He wanted that egg more than he wanted the riches of this world.

We need to stop looking at the occupants of the world and pitying them. In

our eyes they may be insignificant and, as mother would say, "Not worth a plug nickel." But when the Father remembered what He originally planned for them, before Adam and Eve transgressed in the Garden, and knew that His masterpiece still could be realized if He were willing to pay the price for their restoration, He not only was willing, but set the operation in motion. Thank God. We had not lost any real value to Him.

A Clean Slate

Psalm 130:3-4 (NKJV)—If You, Lord, should mark iniquities, O Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You, that You may be feared [worshiped].

his verse says that God is worshiped because He forgives. Like our Father, we should develop the habit of forgiving. While we don't want anyone to worship us, we could certainly be used by God to bring out the best in others.

In the novel *Anne of Green Gables*, a boy messes up royally by playing hooky from school. Later in the day, the boy's parents and teacher come together by chance. Instead of highlighting the boy's wrongdoing, though, the teacher tells his parents how wonderful it is that he has volunteered to do some repair work at the school.

With this approach, the teacher accomplishes three things. She gains the student's respect, she makes his parents' hearts glad, and she gets some much-needed work done at the school.

God takes this same approach with us. The more He erases the slate of our sins, the more we learn to forgive others and the more we worship Him.

I have had to learn that everything of value involves risk. Just because I have chosen to overlook others' wrongdoing does not mean I am giving them license to sin. Wrongdoing is the fruit of wrong thinking. I don't want to miss helping people who are genuinely sorry for their sins by becoming rigid in measuring out punishment. I never want to forget that the same merciful and gracious God who is slow to anger, abundant in lovingkindness, and relents from doing harm (Jonah 4:2, NKJV) is also my Father and my Judge. I'd rather risk being wronged by others than misrepresent my forgiving Father.

Father, I thank You that You wipe our slates clean of former sins. Thank You that Your tender mercies come quickly to meet us. Your habit of forgiving and restoring us is one we need to learn in our relationships with people. Your great power provides us with Your longsuffering and abundance of mercy. We need both, and we thank You for caring to the point of taking the risk that we may make the same mistakes and take part in the same sins again. We choose to obey You, and we choose to forgive as You do, in Jesus' name. Amen.

A Confirmed Covenant

Isaiah 49:10 (NIV)—"They will neither hunger nor thirst, nor will the desert heat or the sun beat upon them. He who has compassion on them will guide them and lead them beside springs of water."

ears ago, drought and record heat were occurring all over the United States, causing meteorologists and those lacking understanding of their covenant some serious concern. In the midst of it, I was delighted to be reminded of promises like Isaiah 49:10 and Philippians 4:19, which hold me very steady when things in the natural are challenging. I never concern myself with having enough food or water, because God provides both to sustain me while I continue to be faithful and fruitful.

In the midst of the drought, I scheduled a family vacation for the following month in Palm Desert, California. Some said I needed my head examined for scheduling our vacation then, but I knew that the One who has compassion on me had guided me to schedule the vacation for that place and for that time. Therefore, I did not expect my family to be affected negatively by the heat or the sun while we were in the desert.

Lack in any area does not concern me. Confidence in my confirmed covenant is what I must stay focused on at all times. I am never sure where the food, the water, or the shade will come from, but I know beyond a shadow of doubt who provides and directs me to the provisions.

Father, today I acknowledge that all my help comes from You, and You are always timely. I thank You that I can boldly say I have never seen the righteous forsaken, nor his seed begging bread (Psalm 37:25).

Famines, droughts, and disasters of all types come, but they shall not come near me. When I was seven years old, You promised to supply my daily bread, and You have for these many years. I am grateful. Considering Your track record with me, to not trust You would be to insult You and to see You as an infidel who fails to provide for his household. But I know I can trust You, for I have a covenant with You. And that covenant is firm because You have repeatedly confirmed every promise You have made to me personally. Thank You again, in Jesus' name. Amen.

A Dependable God

Psalm 130:5 (NLT)—I am counting on the Lord; yes, I am counting on him. I have put my hope in his word.

I see three things that shaped my independent attitude.

The first influence was fear. I feared that those I looked to for support would one day leave through death, divorce, or for any of various reasons. I became as independent as I could to avoid the sense of loss that would accompany the loss of another person.

The second influence was my observation of others becoming weak because a spouse, a parent, children, employers, or friends did so much for them. I remained as strong as I could by being independent of assistance from others.

The third influence was the controllers. These were the people who thought they could manipulate others' lives and choices to benefit themselves if they made people dependent on them. I remained independent to avoid being used by these people.

I am not a user; I am a giver. I enjoy giving and doing for others. It excites me to be used to light up another person's face. I like to give big gifts as well as small ones. I guess you might say I like to give what is needed or desired for the moment to help remind people that God knows where they are.

One day, as I was indulging in some inward pride for being under no obligation to anyone and being independent, the Spirit of God spoke to me. He reminded me that my future success was in remaining humble and coming daily to Him as a little child would come to her parents.

I will never forget when, at seven years of age, I questioned why God would not just give me a week's or year's supply of my bread. He said the reason He would only give me my daily bread was that I needed to confer with Him every day.

God had no problem with my being independent of others—as long as I became totally dependent on Him. I have put my hope in God's Word because it never changes, it never fails. God's Word keeps me walking in victory when destruction and defeat are playing their latest tune, trying to get me to march to their beat.

And it shall come to pass in the last days, saith God, I will pour out of my Spirit upon all flesh: and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams: And on my servants and on my handmaidens I will pour out in those days of my Spirit; and they shall prophesy: And I will shew wonders in heaven above, and signs in the earth beneath; blood, and fire, and vapour of smoke: The sun shall be turned into darkness, and the moon into blood, before that great and notable day of the Lord come: And it shall come to pass, that whosoever shall call on the name of the Lord shall be saved. Acts 2:17-21

A Name You Can Trust

Psalm 9:10 (NIV)—Those who know your name will trust in you, for you, Lord, have never forsaken those who seek you.

In my childhood, I often heard certain names which represented certain positions in life: Rockefeller, Dupont, Mellon, Rothchild, Mussolini, Churchill, Roosevelt, and Stalin. I knew those names had no effect on my life personally, so to me they were just names.

Later in life, I met certain people whose names were also very popular. Many of them had a profound effect on me and my family, but I've learned not to put my confidence in any flesh.

My mother-in-law used to say to my husband, "All flesh is as grass, so learn to wear this world and everyone as a loose garment."

The day I became personally acquainted with the Man Jesus Christ, He introduced me to His Father God and His Holy Spirit. Though I knew all Three, it was not until I began to pursue a


God will never forsake those who seek Him.

personal, intimate, and committed relationship with Them that I began to be secure in what we had together. The more I ran after Them, the more They ran towards me.

It worked the opposite of the way relationships in the world work. The more you go after the things and people in the world, the more elusive they become.

God is not that way. He will never forsake those who seek Him. The relationship begins when we are introduced to Him. Once we know Him and His name, trust enters the relationship.

Dear God, there is one thing I know for sure, and that is who You are. I know the value of Jesus' name in my life. The Person of the Holy Spirit leads me and guides me daily. Because of this, my life is now a life of seeking You first—Your kingdom and Your righteousness. You do not forsake me, but You increase, add, and multiply much to my life that places me in a better position to serve others.



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A Scorecard Is Not Kept

Psalm 130:3 (KJV)—If thou, Lord, shouldest mark iniquities. O Lord, who shall stand?

If God kept scorecards or regarded our moral evils and personal faults, He would not be *the* God, Creator of the universe. He wouldn't qualify, because that is exactly what humans do to each other.

If God were to look narrowly on our shortcomings, our future would be about as certain as that of a snowball in hell. But instead, He awaits the sounds of our voices lifted up to Him in true repentance, asking Him to forgive us and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. We never have to ask God to forget what we have done. He automatically does that when we request forgiveness. That is what makes Him God.

Humans forgive also, but seldom do they forget the negative

deeds others do to them. Therefore, I never ask or expect anyone to forget the wrong I have done the them. I only ask their forgiveness because I know that only God can and will forget. Only He has no record or score-

card against me. This is not all bad because it has made me recognize the long-lasting effect my negative tone, deed, or attitude can have on another. It has helped me assess what I am about to say or do so that even an innocent observer will not have to see me in a negative light forever.

Stop trying to force people to forget the wrongs you committed against them. They can't. The best you can hope for is that they will forgive you. Let it be consolation enough for you that your Father's forgiving and forgetful love has provided an avenue of escape from condemnation and guilt. Because of Jesus, you have been made free and your record has been swept clean!

Acceptance Brings Illumination

John 13:7 (KJV)—Jesus answered and said unto him, What I do thou knowest not now; but thou shalt know hereafter.

le must learn to accept the move of God. When we do, He illuminates our understanding.

Initially, though, He is not interested in our understanding Him. He is looking for us to have such an intimate relationship

Him. He is looking for us to have such an intimate relationship with Him that we simply follow. It is called faith. Without faith, pleasing God is impossible.

I used to understand less of what God was saying and doing than I do now. In fact, my opinion of what I thought He was doing was evident in my explanation of Him and His actions. Today, I seldom try to explain God's reason, and I rarely share my opinions about what He is doing. I know that He knows the complete story and that whatever He is permitting, He is using to work for my good.

God is not keeping any secrets from us, nor is He waiting for us to understand what He is doing before we

decide to obey Him and accept His actions.

Obedience and acceptance can only follow trust's lead. It is just a lot easier to obey someone or something you trust. I am grateful for a reputation that causes some people to go along with a project that I am involved with, even when I have either not had time to fully explain it or my explanation was still somewhat hazy. For example, my husband didn't always understand my plans (nor I his), but we became so intimate and trusting of each other that often we simply accepted what the other one was doing just because of our track record with one another.

Surely by now God's track record with us is such that we can decide to accept first and understand later. Jesus promised us that we would indeed understand later. Therefore, I choose to wait for both my change and my understanding to come as I move out with Him.

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Act Justly, Love Mercy, and Walk Humbly

Micah 5:4 (NIV)—He will stand and shepherd his flock in the strength of the Lord, in the majesty of the name of the Lord his God. And they will live securely, for then his greatness will reach to the ends of the earth.

e certainly understand that Micah 5:4 is speaking of the promised ruler from Bethlehem, Jesus Christ. But as His body, we can also see this as a great example for pastors to follow as they shepherd God's people.

When my husband and I knew we were called to pastor, we said to God, "If You don't give us a supernatural ministry, don't give us any ministry at all." By that, we simply meant that we knew it would take God's constant involvement to shepherd His people. Without question, the sheep could only live securely and be at peace with themselves if they had the strength of the Lord and the majesty of His name to prove His greatness on their behalf.

No human qualifies to lead a congregation in his or her own strength. No matter how many gadgets, gimmicks, promotional plans, and schemes a pastor comes up with, it won't be enough to effectively care for God's people. It takes God's strength, through Jesus, by the Holy Ghost, to enable a person to stand and shepherd God's people.

The majesty of God's name proves His greatness in the earth. The name of Jesus, the person of Jesus, is all we need to do great exploits in the earth.

How do we do this? Micah 6:8 tells us: "He has showed you, O man, what is good. And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God."

Dear Father God, What we should do to please You is so plain and simple. All of our work, labor, and sacrifice are in vain if we fail to follow this very basic formula: to act justly, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with You. Teach us to be fair in all our dealings with others. Show us how to dispense mercy whenever and wherever it is needed. May we never become puffed up with pride because of the mighty things You do for, in, and with us. When the final chapter is recorded, all that we will have done will be the result of Your strength and the authority You have given us in the majestic name of Jesus, Your beloved Son.

Admission Granted

Ephesians 2:18 (KJV)—For through him we both have access by one Spirit unto the Father.

he shed blood of Jesus Christ has become my admission slip to the Father God. It is because His Spirit summoned me toward Him that I now have permission to approach Him. This same faith that justified me and gave me peace through my Lord Jesus also provided access, or admission, to His grace.

In His grace, I experience His divine influence upon my heart and its reflection into my life. His favor and benefit package is found in His grace. His joy, His liberality, and His pleasure are all found in His grace. God by His Spirit is wooing us to Him.

Before Christ abolished in His flesh the commandments and requirements that distinguished the Jew from the Gentile, I had no permission or access to God. Nothing you and I had would qualify us to be admitted to the presence of God, where everything we wanted or needed awaited us.

But once His shed blood provided for us His grace and favor, we could with confidence access Him and His benefits. Drawing near to the Creator of the universe as His child will cause your head to tilt but your spirit to rejoice.

Does approaching God with confidence, as Ephesians 3:12 suggests, seem far out? It should not stagger us at all. After all, the same Spirit wooing us to Himself is also sustaining us by giving us the spirit to trust Him. We can't trust God and His promises without His giving us His spirit of faith. Without that fruit of the Spirit we would be lost and without hope. Because we have access by faith into this grace, we stand and rejoice in hope of the glory of God.

Father, for whom Your whole family is named, thank You for providing us with admission to You through Jesus. Our hope is in Your glory being manifested. For this we shout hallelujah. Our hope in You will not be ashamed or disappointed because this access is ultimately to Your love, which is spread throughout our hearts by Your Spirit.

An Established Heart

Hebrews 13:9 (KJV)—Be not carried away with divers and strange doctrines. For it is a good thing that the heart be established by grace; not with meats, which have not profited them that have been occupied therein.

ur hearts represent our thoughts, our emotions, and the core of our existence. It is our control center. Since Jesus is neverchanging, the focus of our hearts must continually be on Him.

Jewish law allowed and also forbade various foreign and alien teachings about food or related articles that in no way benefited them; neither are such rules and observances advantageous to us, because they contribute in no way to divinely influencing our control center. Jesus Himself noted that what goes into a man's stomach does not defile him, but that which proceeds from the

Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever. His Word and the example of His life are to be our focus.

heart is what defiles (Matthew 15:16-20). Furthermore, merely external observances do not reflect in our lives what God has established for us.

Apart from God's

divine influence (grace) on our thoughts, emotions, and actions, we are not confirmed or stabilized by anything that could make us pleasing to God. His grace is not only sufficient: it is the protective barrier to ward off any forces that come against us to deter and

detract us from the master plan.

Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever. His Word and the example of His life are to be our focus. Don't allow yourself to become attracted to and follow strange observances and ceremonial rules that have no spiritual power to impart. Do not follow any observance or teaching you hear unless your "control center"—your spirit—confirms it with the peace that is only known by a believer whose heart is established upon the Word of God.



GOD'S CHILDREN ARE VALUABLE

ne of the blessings of being a pastor is the opportunity to observe the growth and maturity of the sheep. However, one of the disadvantages of filling the role of a shepherd is the ever-present tendency to forget that the sheep don't belong to us but to God. One of the first things that we as pastors need to do is what Moses did: recognize our need to know God. The only way to know God is to have Him show us His way. But He will only show us His way when we find grace in His sight. Once I determined that the sheep we are called to shepherd belong to God, I made it my goal to consult with Him-first, to get to know Him; then to inquire regarding His ways. One thing I quickly learned was that I couldn't have any favorites. All God's children are valuable and precious to Him, and the rules are the same for everyone-regardless of appearance or personality.

Apply the Principle, Reap the Reward

2 Peter 1:5 (NLT)—So make every effort to apply the benefits of these promises to your life. Then your faith will produce a life of moral excellence. A life of moral excellence leads to knowing God better.

od has done His part in our development and growth as Christians. Now we are to make every effort to apply what has been decreed and established. We need to add more to each of the virtues we have in Christ.

When we apply God's principles and promises to our lives, He produces excellence in us. This is just the beginning of what we are to put into our growth. A life of moral excellence will enable

A life of moral excellence will enable us to get to know God better. Knowing God better allows us to control ourselves.

us to get to know God better. Knowing God better allows us to control ourselves. This leads to patient endurance, which leads to godliness. Godliness leads first to love for other believers and, finally, to love and compassion for God's creation.

The purpose for all of this

increased input is to make us more productive and useful in our knowledge of Jesus. If we neglect to develop these benefits and promises, we become blind or nearsighted regarding what is truly valuable and important in God's scheme of things; we forget that God has cleansed us from our old life and nature of sin.

Ridding ourselves of sin and increasing God's gifts in us leads to a life of holiness and attracts others to the same life. People are looking for leaders who have found their place in life and appear to be happy enough with it to make outsiders envious.

Seeking to live out God's promises is about being so like God that those without Him are attracted to Him in us. Why would I want to follow someone who has lost his own grip on life? I want a tried, true, and proven vessel to follow when I am facing challenges finding my own way.

As Good As It Gets

Colossians 2:9 (KJV)—For in him dwelleth all the fulness of the Godhead bodily.

hen you and I accepted Christ, we got more than just a free ticket to heaven. We received all that God was, all that He is, and all that He will ever be. As if that were not enough, we also received all that the Holy Spirit was, is, and will ever be.

This is why Colossians 2:10 is so thrilling: "And ye are complete in Him." This is as good as it gets! The fullness of the Godhead lives in Christ, and He lives in you and me. Bastard Is Not Your Name

Hebrews 12:8 (NLT)—If God doesn't discipline you as he does all of his children, it means that you are illegitimate and are not really his children after all.

ailure to submit to a particular minister will not make a person a bastard. Paul said that the discipline of God is what identifies a person as His children. How, then, can a born-again child of God ever be a "bastard"?

God becomes our Father when we receive His Son as our Savior. In Matthew 23:2-4 Jesus warned religious leaders of their responsibility only to act as official interpreters of the Scriptures. He then admonished the people to obey and practice every word they said but not to follow their example because they did not practice what they preached.

He further stated that everything they did was for show (verse 5). In verses 8 and 9 He taught us that we should not allow others to call us "Rabbi" because we have only one Teacher and all of us humans are on the same level as sisters and brothers. He continued with a charge to call no one here on the earth "Father" because only God in heaven is our spiritual Father. Don't let anyone call you "Master" either, because there is only one Master—the Messiah.

Everything we have does not come from human beings; it comes from heaven. James 1:17 says that every good and perfect gift comes down from the Father above.

Don't be deceived into thinking that your reward and your increase are the result of your associations with anyone except Jesus Christ. Quantity without quality does not equal value.

Keep your focus on Jesus. Keep your mind on Jesus. Set your affections on Jesus, and you will find that you are led by His Spirit, not driven, dragged, pushed, and shoved into activities and events that are not yet for the season God has you in.

Your Father God is not withholding any good thing from you that a human can supply. What is happening is that His will and pleasure are being worked in you to prepare you to go when He says "go." You are His child. Bastard is not your name.



any years ago, before I was converted as a sanctified bornagain Christian, I still provided my houseguests with some of the finest liquor available. I sensed that God was not thrilled with this, but most of the Christians I knew drank (including the pastor and the church officials).

The Spirit of God spoke to me one Saturday as I was attempting to do what I often did when I did not want to deal with a matter: I would go to sleep. Only this time, sleep was not cooperating. God asked me about all the opened and unopened alcoholic beverages in my home bar. I responded, "But Lord, I don't partake of that anymore. Are You suggesting that I pour it all out? After all, it represents lots of dollars." He reminded me that He had given us that money, which we had spent on the bar, and He showed me that I should not offer to someone else what I would not want for myself.

The conversation ended there, and I made my choice. The next voice I heard was my son Kyle's as he came to see what was going on. You see, the aroma from the numerous bottles of wine and champagne being poured out had permeated the entire house. My comment was "Hush and bring me some more bottles." This thing needed to be done—and quickly, before my head calculated the cost.

Since that time, I have understood the importance of being single-minded about every spiritual choice. A double-minded man is unstable in all his ways and can expect nothing from God (James 1:7-8). God wants us to live long in the provisions He has made for us. He knows that the enemy will cause us to stumble when we fail to rid ourselves of negative options.

Having a plan B is an abomination in God's eyes. We must rid ourselves of idols as an affirmation of our love and commitment to the only God we will serve. Stop lying to yourself that you are strong enough to have other options and not be affected by them. Make a choice to eliminate choices. Go with God.

Blind to the Truth

Revelation 3:17 (KJV)—Because thou sayest, I am rich, and increased with goods, and have need of nothing; and knowest not that thou art wretched, and miserable, and poor, and blind, and naked.

here is nothing wrong with wealth and increase, as long as we don't brag that because of it we have need of nothing. If we say these words from our hearts, then our hearts need to be cleansed.

Jesus essentially said to the angel of this "we've-got-it-made" group, "I know you inside and out, and I find little to my liking. You brag, saying, 'I'm rich; I need nothing from anyone,' but you are oblivious to the truth that, in fact, you're pitiful, blind, beggarly, and homeless."

How could they not know? "The cares of this world, and the deceitfulness of riches, and the lusts of other things, entering in" had choked the Word in them, making them unfruitful (Mark 4:19).

We can clearly see from these verses that we can have great riches and accumulation and yet be oblivious to the truth. Sadly, we can become oblivious to the truth of God's Word, which has been choked, and oblivious to the truth that Jesus sees us as wretched, miserable, poor, blind, and naked.

That's a tough state to be in naturally speaking. But it is a worse state to have wealth and increase covering up the truth that we are like that in the spirit realm.

The Holy Spirit makes things transparent that we hoped no one would ever see. Imagine thinking the world sees us as being blessed of the Lord, while the Lord allows them to see what we really are in the spirit. If we rely on our wealth to make us self-sufficient we are not blessed, we are miserable.

Precious Father, God of all truth, help us see who we really are and what we are really doing in Your kingdom before it's too late. Lord Jesus, the price You paid at Calvary is higher than anyone else can pay; yet, because of Your grace, You have truly cancelled this debt. The empty tree and tomb are the proof of that. Continue to work in us what we must work outwardly for Your glory, in Jesus' name. Amen.

Then I Will Command My Blessings on You

Leviticus 25:21 (NKJV)—Then I will command My blessing on you in the sixth year and it will bring forth produce [fruit] enough for three years.

od's command of anything, especially His blessing, will do what He commands it to do.

How is the spirit that is motivating them going to be addressed? The same way God always deals with everything. Love, mercy, and truth will win over anything the enemy throws at God or His people.




enemies whipped them and caused them to retreat.

You Have Skirted This Mountain Long Enough

Deuteronomy 2:2-3 (NKJV)—And the Lord spoke to me saying: "You have skirted this mountain long enough; turn northward."

re you tired of making tracks and going nowhere? That happens to many of us. Skirting anything means you are circling it. You just keep doing the same thing over and over. It is a road that leads nowhere.

You may need to change some people in your life. Check them out. Are they making any progress with their own lives? If not, you can believe hanging out with them will also stunt your growth.

There may need to be a change in the neighborhood you're living in. The best way I know to change the neighborhood you live in is to move out because usually the neighborhood becomes the people who inhabit it.

Do you know why we skirt our mountains too long?

Often we are waiting for people who never were intended to accompany us on our journey. Sometimes we try to hold on to family property only to have it become an albatross around our necks. That dream house or car can keep you repeating the same things.

When you leave here, and you will one day, you are not going to be able to take anything with you. When you go, you will be separated from anything here.

The Lord recently spoke to me and shared that He could not give me everything at once because it would overwhelm me and cause me to stumble. But I could depend on Him to provide what I needed each day to be successful. So I chose to take success one day at a time, enjoy it, and be excited knowing that tomorrow is going to come with its own share of success.

Thank You, Father, for showing me that I, too, was skirting the same mountain and it was time for a change.

You Shall Not Listen

Deuteronomy 13:1-3 (NLT)—Suppose there are prophets among you, or those who have dreams about the future, and they promise you signs or miracles, and the predicted signs or miracles take place. If the prophets then say, "Come, let us worship the gods of foreign nations," do not listen to them. The Lord your God is testing you to see if you love him with all your heart and soul.

ow often we have said, "You'll know if someone is a true prophet or a dreamer if what he said or did comes to pass."

That fact is true providing they are not demonstrating signs and wonders with the purpose of turning you away from what you believe and in whom you believe.

Signs and wonders can be performed by the devil and his crowd.

Apostasy is the renunciation of your faith. It is abandonment of a previous loyalty. Anytime someone attempts to get you to defect from the truth that Jesus is the Christ, He was born of a virgin, He died on a tree, He went into hell, He rose on the third day, and He is coming back again, he may be a prophet or a dreamer but he is a false one. Never allow signs and wonders or even miracles to hinder you from believing that Jesus Christ is God having come in the flesh.

How are you going to know? Listen to the rest of his message to hear exactly what he is saying and, then make a choice not to listen if what he is saying is a lie. "By this you know the Spirit of God: Every spirit that confesses that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is of God, and every spirit that does not confess that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is not of God. And this is the spirit of the Antichrist, which you have heard was coming, and is now already in the world" (1 John 4:2-3, NKJV).

The time has come for the believer to grow up and be aware of antichrist deceivers because many false prophets have gone out into the world.

Your Hand and Your Purpose Determined

Acts 4:27-28 (NKJV)—For truly against your servant Jesus, whom you anointed, both Herod and Pontius Pilate, with the Gentiles and the people of Israel, were gathered together to do whatever your hand and your purpose determined before to be done.

he crucifixion of Jesus was a setup. God's hand and His purpose determined long before Gethsemane, long before Golgotha, what was to take place with Jesus.

The crowd, used to execute God's hand and God's purpose, consisted of Herod, Pilate, the Gentiles, and the Jews. But it was God's hand that determined when, where, and how Jesus would die. It was God's hand that determined to nail Him to the cross. But because God is spirit, He used them in the natural. God determined to do this so He would not have to determine that it would happen to us.

They did not know that they were doing the will or purpose of God the Father. Had they known, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory. But God knew what He was doing. Often we condemn things because we do not understand God's purpose.

Hebrews 12:2 (NKJV) reads, "Looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross." What was the joy? (1) That He was going to please His Father by redeeming us. (2) He was again going to set down in a position of authority, not sit down.

He was appointed to a position of designated authority at the right hand of God so that He could be the strength we need to approach His Father. To be set at the right hand of the throne of God is not talking about reclining or resting on a chair or bench, or even a couch. Jesus, because of His obedience to death, was set by His Father in a permanent place of authority not only to worship Him but to approach Him on our behalf.

Jesus is the appointed power of God in the Universe. Receive Him and you'll receive the Father.

recently had to repent for some plans that I was making for a year from now.

I believe the Lord had asked me to invite a certain person to

speak to us at the 25th anniversary of the church and I did. What I forgot to do was say, "If the Lord wills, we shall live and do this or that" (James 4:15).

Too often we set aside the truth that all of us are like vapor, the morning fog, and we forget that

Since death is more sure than taxes, each of us should ask for the grace of God to live each moment and day as though it were our last.

The important thing for us to remember is to try to encourage others to believe, as with Jesus, they have a season here and a work to be done during that time and there isn't any need to stay once their task is complete.

Don't spend your life heaping up riches and not knowing by whom or how they will be spent. Keep your hope in the Lord who hears every prayer.

his is my spiritual insurance policy from the Lord.
Since I am clear that He cannot lie, Titus 1:2, I rest in whatever proceeds from His mouth. He is never going to change what He said. Why should He? He cannot improve upon it and it was truth when He uttered it, so why would a change be necessary?

Don't you wish that you could depend upon the words of others to that degree?

We have Christian young women saying marriage vows solely for the purpose of having a legitimate baby, for they also are saying that after the baby is born they plan to divorce their spouse. That is spiritual immaturity and the Lord will not be pleased.

We need to include Psalm 89:34 in our marriage vows and stay

with it. God keeps His Word. We must learn to do the same. Words are never frivolous and unimportant. That's why Mama always said, "Think before you speak."

God does not deal falsely with us concerning His righteousness, His faithfulness, His love and mercy, or anything else He has promised us. Part of our growing up spiritually is to imitate Him in our character and let our word be our bond.

Train yourself not to be a covenant breaker. Never make a covenant until you understand the importance of keeping it. Let the words that proceed from your mouth mean what you say and say what you mean, then stick to it come what may.

May the God of all creation help us to know that our words are much more than sounds uttered from our mouths. They have power to accomplish and they never cease to exist until they have done what they were sent out to do.

What are you saying and do you really want what you're saying as a part of your life on a permanent basis?

Say this with meaning, "My covenant I will not break nor will I alter the word that goes out from my mouth, in Jesus' name."

It Is Important to Recognize His Voice

Job 33:14 (NLT)—But God speaks again and again, though people do not recognize it.

his was a statement by Job's friend, Elihu.
Elihu knew enough to be dangerous. He, like so many, convoluted Scripture by mixing truth and philosophy, truth and tradition, truth and culture, and, most of all, truth and opinion.

Truth does not need any support. It is pure and peaceable. Therefore, anything that we misuse or add to it makes it error.

What Elihu said in verse 14 is truth. God does speak again and again though people do not recognize it.

Failure to recognize the voice of God could be costly.

Failure to recognize the voice of God is a sign of immaturity and lack of discipline in spiritual things.

God's love and compassion do not allow Him to stop talking to us. He must continue to speak until His sound is as familiar to our hearing as our own voice. A part of our problem is that we compare God with anything or anyone, which means that we have our ears tuned to hear when, in fact, He is speaking to our hearts.

Our inner man hears every word that the Lord is saying and comprehends. But getting that understanding from the spirit realm to the natural takes more training. Unless and until we develop the ear of our inner man, we will often miss the still small voice of the Lord.

I often say if the voice you are hearing is driving you to do something it is not of God. However, if the voice you are hearing is leading you by gentle suggestions and your spirit man or your heart feels good about it, most likely it is the Lord. His Spirit leads you; the devil drives you.

The only time I have known the Lord to go silent on me was when I neglected to do what He had already spoken to me. After all, what is the point of Him talking if I won't listen and obey?

That is usually resolved by me repenting and agreeing to obey what He said last. Are you there yet?

1 Chronicles 17:27 (NKJV)—"Now You have been pleased to bless the house of Your servant, that it may continue before You forever, for You have blessed it, O Lord, and it shall be blessed forever."

hat is a promise I can live with. But it was part of His covenant with David.

What is the difference? Why are some more blessed than others? What did they do that you didn't?

Most of the time, when I ask myself these questions, the usual response is that it is not because of me; it's a God thing. It's about His plans and purposes.

You and I seldom qualify for the goodness and blessings of the Lord. In fact, often when people find out what is required to experience and enjoy His goodness, some disqualify themselves.

"To whom much is given, from him much will be required" (Luke 12:48, NKJV). This is one of the verses that stood out to me when I became serious about my life with Jesus. I instinctively knew that the Lord's blessings toward me would not be "just because." I knew that there would be moments when I would have to make tough choices and be willing to go it alone in Christ Jesus as my Lord.

Luke 12:41-42 (NLT), "Peter asked, 'Lord, is this illustration just for us or for everyone?' And the Lord replied, 'I'm talking to any faithful, sensible servant to whom the master gives the responsibility of managing his household and feeding his family.'"

Read the verses right up to verse 48. Though the evil servant had the same opportunity as the faithful servant, he made some unwise choices. The Lord is not interested in doing more for one than He does for the other.

Our house is blessed forever when we submit to the teachings and lifestyle of Jesus. The Lord's desire is not to bless just a physical house; His desire is to bless our spiritual house where He rules and reigns.

The physical structure you live in is a building to shelter and house your real house, the new person that you have become because of Jesus. Give attention to Him.

Jesus Rules and Reigns Forever

Daniel 7:14 (NKJV)—Then to Him was given dominion and glory and a kingdom, that all peoples, nations, and languages should serve Him. His dominion is an everlasting dominion which shall not pass away, and His kingdom the one which shall not be destroyed.

olks, this is talking about none other than Jesus Christ of Nazareth.

It matters not who is in charge or how bad things get, Daniel 7:14 gives us the conclusion of God's story and it is always for our good and His glory.

This verse is for you and me but it does not exclude others. We will all serve Him. We don't have to speak the same language with our tongues as long as our hearts are the same toward Him.

His place of authority is a gift from our Father and He will rule forever. His area of authority shall not pass away or be destroyed.


I don't know about you, but I intend to be in His camp and on His team.

Just Be Ready When He Comes

Mark 13:35 (NKJV)—Watch, therefore, for you do not know when the master of the house is coming—in the evening, at midnight, at the crowing of the rooster, or in the morning.

he Scripture tells us that no one, not the angels in heaven nor the Son, but only the Father, knows the day or hour when Jesus will return. My choice is to live in such a way that when

The devil knows that he cannot stop us so he tries to delay us as much as he can.

He returns I can be found ready to go with Him.

Think about it. If God the Father did not reveal to His Son or to His angels when He is going to return, it is

silly for you and me to speculate. I recommend that since He is coming suddenly that we be found doing our assignment.

Jesus is not suggesting that we abstain from physical sleep when, in verse 36, He says, "Lest, coming suddenly, he find you sleeping." Never allow the necessities or the distractions of this world to dull your sensitivity to spiritual things. Be alert to what is going on so you can stay prepared to receive Him when He comes, and, at the same time, be so detached that you are ready to go with Him, because we are the only reason that He is coming back. He is boldly and compassionately saying to all, "Watch."

I used to ask the Lord to fix, change, or correct everything and everyone that was on assignment to impede my spiritual progress.

I now realize how amusing He must have found my feeble, little prayer when, in fact, He was allowing (not causing) these things to help me flex my faith and prayer muscles in order to grow more to meet every challenge that life would bring my way.

Stay alert to what the enemy is trying to do to steal the Word sown in our hearts and, thereby, hinder God's plan in our lives.

Wake up and pay attention. The devil knows that he cannot stop us so he tries to delay us as much as he can. Make sure you say "yes" when you mean yes and "no" at other times.

Justice Delayed Is Not Justice Denied

Psalm 94:15 (NKJV)—But judgment will return to righteousness, and all the upright in heart will follow.

ne of the major mistakes people in the United States make at election time is to vote for a man or vote by party. In this country we have the blessed privilege of voting our heart. No Christian should ever go into a polling place, close the curtain, and pull the lever without first having heard from God.

Anyone with the Spirit of God can and should discern the time we're living in. Wicked men and the spirit of lawlessness are running rampant in the earth, just as the Bible said. But that is not the conclusion of the matter, righteousness and justice will return and God's people, those who have purposed in their heart to follow Him, will follow Him and all that He stands for.

Never confuse delayed justice with denied justice. God, through His precious Son, Jesus, will deliver us. He will make the crooked paths straight. He has given us a future filled with hope in His Beloved Son who is our Savior. Make Him your Lord also.

Look at Psalm 94:21-23 and rejoice in the God of your defense.

"They gather together against the life of the righteous, and condemn innocent blood. But the Lord has been my defense and my God the rock of my refuge. God's own judgment has brought on them their iniquity and shall cut them off in their own wickedness."

This is a promise of our protection and the destruction of the wicked. We should not rejoice until or unless they come to Christ. God does not want anyone destroyed. The day of God's judgment is not a day He is looking forward to. But it will come to pass for those who will not walk the path He laid out for them or who devise ways to hurt His children. He will protect us, and reward our enemies accordingly.

Today is the day to make the right choice. Accept His Son, request His help to turn from what you have been doing and become one of His.

Measured Forgiveness

Luke 6:38 (NKJV)—"Give, and it shall be given unto you: good measure, pressed down, shaken together and running over will be put into your bosom. For with the same measure that you use, it will be measured back to you."

his verse is used often for financial gain but it goes much deeper than that. Seed, not just deed, is what grows and multiplies.

Seldom do we think of forgiveness as seed to be sown, but with the same degree we forgive, we determine the degree that God will forgive us. (Luke 6:37)

All of us need to be forgiven. All of us need to forgive. Think of it as investing in the future. My flesh never wants to forgive and it gladly will help me focus on and rehearse all of the ugly done to me for as long as I want to indulge in it. The same is true of you.

Jump on unforgiveness immediately with both spiritual feet and refuse to entertain an offense. You can't do it in the natural. The ill deed becomes a monster in your life that only can be killed by the Spirit of Christ. He does not go away or die except by love and forgiveness.

Colossians 3:12-13 must become our way of life, "Therefore, as the elect of God, holy and beloved, put on [dress up in] tender mercies, kindness, humility, meekness, long suffering; bearing with one another, and forgiving one another, if anyone has a complaint against another; even as Christ forgave you, so you must also do."

You would not have been asked to do this if God, who is in Christ, had not equipped you to forgive. He, in Christ, forgave you and me, now we are obligated to forgive others. (See Ephesians 4:32.)

God, through the Lord Jesus Christ, invested in us when we were not deserving of it. But He sowed the seed of forgiveness first which, once we received, we were able to reproduce toward others in need of it. Do it now so your growth will be hindered no longer. Don't forget to ask for His help.

Next to God, Who Is the Greatest?

Matthew 18:3 (NKJV)—"Assuredly, I say to you, unless you are converted and become as little children, you will by no means enter the kingdom of heaven."

here is no question that salvation is the first step back to God. But without a conversion experience, you can never fully appreciate what your salvation really means.

Matthew 18:4 reads, "Therefore whoever humbles himself as this little child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven." God is looking for people who will humble themselves so that He can exalt them.

We get letters daily from ministers wanting to reach the world for Christ, yet they miss the opportunity to speak to the people they work with every day. Are they not important also?

I happened to mention to a friend the possibility of her daughter marrying someone of a different race. It was one of those "Holy Blurts" because it had nothing to do with what we were talking about.

The mother said, "It's funny you would say that. I mentioned that possibility to my husband the other day and he said, 'God would not do that to me. He would not give me a son-in-law of that race." I wanted to cry because I want to believe that this father would do anything to get a person of any race saved into the kingdom, but when it came to a son-in-law he had some deep-seated emotions without realizing it.

It helped me to understand why there is little growth in him and his ministry. The gospel of Jesus Christ is for everyone and any form of prejudice is a "no-no."

Many of us have some form of prejudice that we must deal with daily. We just need to stay honest with God and ourselves and ask for His grace to make the right choices. What are the right choices? Whatever is pleasing to Him and not our personal preferences.

Unless you humble yourself as a little child God will find limited use for you in His plan and scheme for humanity. It is examination time. I believe you can pass the test.

Gifts With Strings Attached

Psalm 103:3 (NLT)—He forgives all my sins and heals all my diseases.

orgiveness and healing are gifts. God does not give cheap or defective gifts. He paid a high price for each of them, and they are lasting, effective, and full of power. They are valuable.

All of us know that there are certain things money cannot buy. These gifts, especially forgiveness and healing, have no price tags for us. Why? It's because once something is purchased, the price tag is removed and it is no longer for sale.

Our forgiveness and our healing are no longer for sale. They were bought with such a high price that only God could afford it. Through Jesus, God bought them, removed the price tag, and gave them as gifts to all who receive eternal life by accepting His beloved Son (John 3:16).

I don't ever recall questioning my salvation. Oh, how I needed to believe that I was saved because I had been such a first-class sinner. Therefore, I readily accepted that I was a cleaned-up, forgiven offspring of God.

When I later understood that the same price was paid for my healing as was paid for my salvation, I became blessed to live in divine health without question or doubt. I have continued to live in health for close to thirty years.

I do not doubt my healing any more than I would doubt my salvation. However, if the voice of the Lord said to me to go for medical assistance and I knew it was He who said it, I would confer with no one and obey the word to seek out help. Once you understand that it is Jesus who forgives and heals, you are not concerned about how He does it. The important thing in all of this is to become so familiar with His voice that all doubt and concern are immediately eliminated as you follow the plan of God for your life.

God has strings attached to His gifts. Yes, He gives to us freely all things. But He requires us to abide in Him as He abides in us. Our obedience to abide in Him is the string to His promises.

Obey God, and accept your healthy and eternal life today.

Glorify God With Your Gift

1 Peter 4:10 (NIV)—Each one should use whatever gift he has received to serve others, faithfully administering God's grace in its various forms.

have no doubt that God's pleasure is to bless His people, and He does it in so many different ways. Evidently He does not give to everyone the same way, because some receive blessings based on their faith in His promises to them and others receive gifts from Him when they do not use faith for them at all.

Of course, all of us must use our faith to continue to use and develop our gifts. And 1 Peter 4:10 says that we are to use these gifts from God to serve others. We must become administrators of His grace. We are not to hoard that grace or the other gifts He gives us, but we are to use them to serve others. We are temporary containers who continuously distribute an ongoing outpouring of His grace. So many people we encounter need to experience God's grace, and He saw fit to use us to disperse it.

Some of the most precious moments in my life were not when I was receiving. I am grateful for those times, but they do not compare to the thrilling moments of observing others' joy when I am obedient to God to bless them with what He has given me. You have to know that the gift came from God before you will be comfortable with giving it away.

Never view a giver as more spiritual than someone else. Never decide that people operating in the spiritual gifts are always in God's presence.

God can use the shallowest believer to operate in the gifts of the Spirit and perform miracles. These people may be undisciplined and out of control when it comes to denying themselves, but when the anointing is flowing they are an explosion going to happen.

Then I have seen others with the fruit of the Spirit growing and operating and manifested to the point of putting the rest of us to shame, yet with the fruit gifts in full form they never operate in ministry gifts.

What I have learned is that it matters not which gifts you have or how many. What matters most is that you administrate your gift in obedience to His direction and to the glory of God.

Go To the Word First

1 John 5:14-15 (NKJV)—Now this is the confidence that we have in Him, that if we ask anything according to His will, He hears us. And if we know that He hears us, whatever we ask, we know that we have the petitions that we have asked of Him.

o one wants to be rejected when making a request. Yet most, if not all, of us have never received all that we have petitioned of God.

What is the solution? First, we must find out what God's will is. And we find it in His Word. Second, we must know beyond a shadow of doubt that God never denies Himself.

The Father never says "no" to Jesus because Jesus never asks anything not in accordance with the will of God. We need to learn this principle to receive our desires from God. Knowing this provides us with an assurance, a confidence, and an elimination of doubt.

Third, we must rest in the fact that requests according to God's will always get God's attention. Fourth, because we do not doubt that He hears us when we ask of Him what He has already willed, we confidently know that what we requested is on its way to us. Our Father never denies Himself.

One of the wisest decisions I ever made was to stop going to God with every little thing that came to mind. Most of it was never realized, and it was affecting my faith. I thought, "Surely if I cannot get Him to give me the little stuff, there is no chance that He will give me the big request." With that kind of attitude, one could find oneself no longer making petitions. Satan knows that when we don't ask God, He is probably not going to sovereignly give us what we don't ask for.

The key for me in changing this attitude was to go first to the Word of God, locate His will regarding what I desired, and then boldly march into the throne room as a child of the King and say, "You said when we as natural parents are reminded of what we said, we seldom, if ever, do not honor our word. Father, I know You always honor Your word, so I thank You in advance for giving me what I need."

God Knows Best

Daniel 10:12 (NLT)—Then he said, "Don't be afraid, Daniel. Since the first day you began to pray for understanding and to humble yourself before your God, your request has been heard in heaven. I have come in answer to your prayer."

hat thrills me about this verse is that the angel gave a pattern for you and me to follow in order for our prayers to be heard. Knowing that I am heard comforts me and encourages me to believe that my heard prayer is also my answered prayer.

Even when the answer may be different than what I had hoped for, that does not bother me. If God does not answer my prayers in the way I wanted, that simply says to me that He knows something about the situation that I don't know. Or that what I am asking for, if answered that way, could limit His plan for my life. His plan is always better than what I can see or know.

What I have learned is that God's plan and thoughts for me are often higher and better than what I thought possible, so I have chosen to pray to understand what God knows is best.

That is how I humble myself. I used to think I knew everything that would make me happy. Now I rest in His setting the pace and the goal.

David sang a song of victory to the Lord when He delivered him from the hand of all his enemies, including Saul (2 Samuel 22:1). I have made the next two verses from that chapter my confession for the present and the future, and I believe and act like they are mine now. David essentially said of the Lord, "He is my rock, my fortress, my deliverer; in Him will I trust. He is my shield, the arm of my salvation, my high tower, my refuge, my Savior, and my rescuer from violence" (2 Samuel 22:2-3).

Daniel prayed in humility for understanding, and God heard him immediately. I believe that my prayer of thanksgiving for the manifestation of God's presence in my life is mine now by faith in what He has already done.

Please join me in believing and trusting in the one true God who wants only His best for you.

God Specializes in Things Thought Impossible

Luke 1:37 (KJV)—For with God nothing shall be impossible.

he word "impossible" does not appear in the Old Testament in the *King James Version* of the Bible. Yet, the people of the Old Testament had as many challenges with their trust in God as we, the Church, have.

When the angel told Mary of Elizabeth's pregnancy in her old age and shared "for with God, nothing shall be impossible," Mary believed Him. She grabbed ahold of "shall be" and ran with it, claiming that what had been and was with Elizabeth "shall be" unto her also.

Never think because you have a negative condition or circumstance that you have a covenant to keep it. It didn't matter to Jesus if a man was born blind, if a woman was bowed over eighteen years, or if a young girl died: He delivered them all. In fact, He raised Jairus' daughter, the ruler's servant, and Lazarus from the dead. God specializes in things thought impossible. What difference does it make to God's ability whether you are crippled or barren, have a fever or a hangnail? *Nothing shall be impossible to God.*

Is your history so sordid and seedy that you would not want anyone to ever know? Give it over to Jesus along with yourself, and watch God restore to you the years that the locusts have eaten (Joel 2:25).

Because of your unbelief and lack of mustard-seed-sized faith to speak to the mountain-sized challenges you are facing, you think things are impossible to you. Jesus said, "Not so." Nothing is impossible to you. When you exercise faith and speak to your mountain, it will move and nothing shall be impossible to you.

Father, the time has come for Your children to take their rightful place in the earth, walking in all of the authority that Calvary's sacrifice provided. It is time for us to stop thinking that anything that is in Your will for humankind is impossible to do. Without faith, it is impossible to please You. Everyone of us who names the name of Christ is empowered by Your Spirit to know what is pleasing to You, so we can please You by speaking out Your will and expecting it to be so.

God's Faithfulness to a Little Girl

Isaiah 40:28-29 (NKJV)—Have you not known? Have you not heard? The everlasting God, the Lord, the Creator of the ends of the earth, neither faints nor is weary. His understanding is unsearchable. He gives power to the weak, and to those who have no might He increases strength.

hough as a child I could not brag about my earthly father, as some children could, I know now how proud the other children were, because my heavenly Father is the biggest, the best, and the most powerful Daddy there is.

This was not always clear to me. In fact, when I was a child, He was just "God"—and that didn't mean much to me. I had heard very little about what was written of Him in the Bible. Unfortunately, the picture of Him others painted for me was one in which He stood looking over the banister of heaven to see whether I was good (in which case, He never bothered me) or bad (in which case, He swatted me like a fly). This painting would not have been so harmful if its artists had just told me how I could live to please God, but they didn't. I was left with a bunch of do's and don'ts.

Sadly, I didn't know of the God who had no end, who had created all things, and who was not weak, weary, or worried about anything. I didn't know that He loved and delighted in me.

When I had moments of weakness, no one ever said that God would empower me with His Holy Spirit. When the tempter's snares were set to entrap me, I didn't understand that God provided a way of escape. When I thought I could no longer put one foot in front of the other, I didn't know that His mighty strength was a gift to me.

I'm still amazed today that, at that point in my life, I had heard enough to cause me to accept His Son as my Savior. Even so, I thought salvation was simply my insurance policy for the future. I wish someone had told me that His grace was sufficient for me to live holy while I was here in the earth and that He would keep me from the evil that was running rampant all around me.

Father, thank You for Your love and Your grace. My life today is truly a manifestation of Your faithfulness to a little girl. Help me share with the children I meet that You are there for them now.

Gratitude Is an Act of Worship

Ephesians 5:20 (KJV)—Giving thanks always for all things....

1 Thessalonians 5:18 (KJV)—In every thing give thanks.

od is not asking us to worship Him for all the bad things that come our way. He does not do bad things to His people, and the time has not come for His wrath to be released against the wicked of the world. He wants so much for as many as will receive His Son to do so before the opportunity is shut down and His irreversible decision on their behalf is released.

God wants to find His people in an attitude of gratitude that says, "Regardless of the adversities, circumstances, and conditions pressing me beyond belief, I choose to allow my words to be a grateful language as an act of worship to Him."

Once you know the nature of God and His will for humankind, and once you know that the reason the devil has not been able to eliminate you is that God is on your side, you begin to praise Him in everything, not for everything.

Another way to look at life's negatives is to say, "Father, though You did not cause or create that awful thing in my life, I want to thank You for allowing it to take place. Because of it, I have learned a new level of endurance and perseverance that I never knew before."

A grateful language is one of the greatest weapons we can have for both offense and defense. A Spirit-controlled, Spirit-directed life is priceless because it declares His divine influence upon our hearts and His reflection in our lives.

Dear Father God, in Jesus' name, I want to say thank You for every experience and every exposure that I have had. Each one has either drawn or pushed me closer to You. It has helped me to learn Your plan for my life and that I can rest in my relationship with You as I move about my daily tasks.

You have not assigned more to me than You have provided grace and strength for me to perform them in excellence, with integrity, by the power Your love working in me. May I never attempt to achieve or accomplish anything ever again without Your love as the motivation.

He Trusted in His God

Daniel 6:23 (NIV)—The king was overjoyed and gave orders to lift Daniel out of the den. And when Daniel was lifted from the den, no wound was found on him, because he had trusted in his God.

anmade rules often cause bondage for the children of God. However, those who remain faithful to God's Word and His plans for them will be at peace in the midst of turmoil, strife, and every evil work.

On our own, we may not be able to change legislation or resist the attacks of the enemy against us. This is why we cannot depend on our earthly position to protect us. In fact, the people who really care about us may be the ones to pronounce sentences on us. That's okay because, at the same time, they may pronounce a blessing on us, as the king did for Daniel: "May your God, whom you serve continually, rescue you!" (verse 16). When they do, their agreement with God's plan is enough to cause our deliverance.

When it appears that God is not going to deliver you from the enemy's clutches, don't despair. He may get more glory by allowing you to stay in the enemy's camp awhile as he renders the enemy helpless against you. Then when others come to observe what has happened to you, they will discover no wound on you and will know that God delivered you.

The wound that guaranteed my protection was placed on Jesus at Calvary. There is no point in both of us being wounded. He was wounded for my transgression. How much more was He wounded for my deliverance?

Dear heavenly Father, praise be to Your name forever and ever. You change times and seasons; You set up and put down kings. You give wisdom to the wise and knowledge to the discerning. You reveal deep and hidden things. I thank and praise You, O God of my fathers. I can enter into Your rest because I trust in You. I need not fear because of who the enemy is, for the battle is in Your hands. I have no personal wars to fight, for You have accepted responsibility for my care and keeping. Because Your Holy Spirit is in me, I have a keen mind, knowledge, and understanding. The ability to interpret dreams, explain riddles, and solve difficult problems is mine to help others in the state of confusion. Thank You for these gifts to help others, in Jesus' name.

Isaiah 35:8 (NIV)—And a highway will be there; it will be called the Way of Holiness. The unclean will not journey on it; it will be for those who walk in that Way; wicked fools will not go about on it.

ften people say that it's hard to be a Christian. I disagree. The hardest part of being a Christian is making the choice to be one. From that point, it becomes the work of the Holy Spirit in us to back every choice we make to obey the Word of God.

For me, the hard part was never being a Christian; it was finding other Christians to be an example for me. I had no problem running into people who would gladly tell me Christianity was the way to go, but then I would observe that they weren't going that way.

Jesus did not promise the Holy Spirit to me so that I could witness to others. He sent the Holy Spirit to me so that I would become a witness. My lifestyle—my works and deeds towards others—is to be the witness.

When I found Isaiah 35:8, I knew it was more than a great idea for a song ("It's a highway to heaven; none can walk up there but the pure in heart..."). I also knew that if holiness were the only way to walk on this "highway" and the wicked fools would never walk it, then evidently God was providing His people with what it took not just to start the journey but also to finish it.

"...Wide is the gate and broad is the road that leads to destruction, and many enter through it. But small is the gate and narrow the road that leads to life, and only a few find it" (Matthew 7:13-14). It's very easy to go to hell; the path is wide and appealing. But heaven and all that Jesus has provided for us are worth the discipline it takes to attain them.

My Father God, the Creator of heaven and earth, I praise You for caring so much that You made heaven possible for those of us who were on that wide path of destruction. Thank You for allowing us to hear Your truth, which caused us to make some wise choices. Now please equip us with the necessary skills and abilities to tell and show others what You have provided for them, in Jesus' name.

The Holy Spirit Is Our Seal

Ephesians 1:13 (KJV)—In whom ye also trusted, after that ye heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation: in whom also after that ye believed, ye were sealed with that holy Spirit of promise.

hen I think of something being sealed, the first word that comes to mind is "protected." I believe we receive protection when we receive the seal of the Holy Spirit. How does this happen? First, we hear the word of truth. Someone who is already sealed testifies of this protection. Second, we trust what we have heard. Third, our trust results in salvation—our submission to being snatched out of darkness and placed in Christ, the light and life of the world. Finally, we can only believe, or become believers, when we ask God to forgive us and then receive His forgiveness as a sign that we trust Him.

When we have done our part to trust, become saved (or voluntarily submit to Him), and believe, the Holy Spirit then comes and does the part that we can't do. He seals us. He stamps us with God's personal signet of security and preservation. He stops the enemy from further access to our spirits.

Oh, the devil will ring your doorbell once in a while; in fact, he may even show up in your physical house. But when he does, ask Jesus to answer your door. Then invite the Holy Spirit to bring into focus His personal signet to identify whose you are. Walk in your God-given right to kick the devil out if he has gained access through others in your house.

The most important thing you can do as a believer is to believe. Trust God as He reveals Himself through the preaching of the gospel, and expect the Holy Spirit to seal you, secure you, and preserve you. When life deals you a blow, rejoice for having been counted worthy to be tested. When you get a lemon, don't get sour; ask the Holy Spirit to help you make some cool lemonade or a rich lemon pie. When others see that you are unaffected by the negatives that happen to everyone, they will want a drink from your glass and a slice of your pie. You set the pace.

Insight and Understanding

Daniel 9:22 (NIV)—He instructed me and said to me, "Daniel, I have now come to give you insight and understanding."

ome things God has decreed are set in motion and will not be changed, regardless of how much or how long we pray. We see in Daniel 9 that God did not change what was going to be because Daniel prayed. What He did was send a messenger to give Daniel insight and understanding of the future. Today we have the Holy Spirit to do the same thing for us.

I have accepted that there are some things I can change because of my words, but there are others that I have no power to change. I simply want to know the difference.

Insight and understanding remove the fear that often accompanies future events. Most of us do not fear the past and can deal with what's current, but the future sometimes causes our hearts to fail us.

My mother used to say, "Never cross a bridge until you get to it." In other words, deal with a matter when it's present. Many things could occur before then to alter the circumstances, and you may not have to go the way your head is taking you in advance. Why cross a bridge twice when once may be enough?

At times, God will speak to us to prepare us for future events that cannot be changed because they are part of His plan and purpose for the future of humankind. Other times, He alerts us about future events to prepare us to take our authority concerning them. Both revelations come from the Holy Spirit, and He brings us insight and understanding to distinguish between them.

Heavenly Father, I thank You that although You are in control and aware of all things concerning Your people, sometimes You act in Your sovereignty and other times You assign Your offspring to take action.

We desire to grow up spiritually to operate with Your mind, Your compassion, Your interest. May our prayers not be contrary to Your plan for humankind and the future. Help us live in such union with You that nothing takes us by surprise. We believe we receive divine insight and clear understanding of all that we need to know, in Jesus' name.

Kept by the Power of God

Psalm 119:9 (KJV)—Wherewithal shall a young man cleanse his way? by taking heed thereto according to thy word.

hen we speak of "kept" men and women, we usually mean someone else is the provider of their needs. Well, the Bible tells us that we are *kept* by the power of God (1 Peter 1:5).

God is our Provider; he supplies all our need according to His riches in glory in Christ Jesus. However, God can't keep our ways pure. That is our responsibility. We are to do it from our youth as we live according to His Word.

There are a lot of excuses being made today concerning the unacceptable conduct and lifestyles of our youth. But it is wrong not to make people accountable for what they say and do. We are not helping our youth by being tolerant of sin and wrongdoing. Sin has been around from the beginning, and the end results are still the same—distress, disturbance, discouragement, and finally death.

Father, help us see our part in imparting truth to our youth by both word and example, in Jesus' name.

Liberty Requires Me to Love

1 Corinthians 8:2-3 (NLT)—Anyone who claims to know all the answers doesn't really know very much. But the person who loves God is the one God knows and cares for.

used to think my liberty in Christ Jesus was the ultimate success. I thought I could do anything I wanted to that was according to God's will and Word, and I had no responsibility to those still in bondage.

That's how I lived until I read this chapter. Verse 6 says, "But we know that there is only one God, the Father, who created everything, and we exist for him. And there is only one Lord, Jesus Christ, through whom God made everything and through whom we have been given life."

Verses 7-9 say, "However, not all Christians realize this. Some are accustomed to thinking of idols as being real, so when they eat food that has been offered to idols, they think of it as the worship of real gods, and their weak consciences are violated. It's true that we can't win God's approval by what we eat or avoid eating, but you must be careful with this freedom of yours. Do not cause a brother or sister with a weaker conscience to stumble."

When I found out that I was responsible for others in the body of Christ, I suddenly remembered the day I looked at our monthold son many years ago and realized that he had the potential of being a six-foot-tall, two hundred-pound human, and I was going to be largely responsible for how he developed!

While we are responsible for the development of every child given to us—spiritually and naturally speaking—at some point, regardless of what we have said or done, they have to assume responsibility for their actions. We can only trust that what we have trained them to do will continue to guide them in the future.

Never allow your knowledge to cause a weak Christian for whom Christ died to be destroyed. When we fail to focus our liberty properly for the freedom of other believers, we sin against Christ.

Today, thank God for your liberty, your life of freedom, and your knowledge. Then, thank Him for His love at work in you. Ask for His wisdom to both enjoy it as well as disperse it to other believers.

Love Was His Purpose

1 Peter 3:18 (KJV)—For Christ also hath once suffered for sins, the just for the unjust, that he might bring us to God, being put to death in the flesh, but quickened by the Spirit.

s a parent and grandparent, I try to imagine my family loving and respecting me so much that they would submit even to death to bring me the very thing that I would have the greatest joy in. I cannot imagine that kind of human love, yet the man Jesus expressed it toward His Father in His death on the cross.

People in the world today do not want to suffer, even when they are guilty. How much more do they exhaust every avenue of appeal if they are innocent?

However, as children of God and representatives of Jesus in the earth, we should be learning the other side of God's blessings. We are to develop such a love for Him that pleasing Him becomes our primary purpose for living.

The Bible certainly requires us to do some things. But what joy, what freedom, what comfort there is in loving God not out of duty but because of the sheer ecstasy we experience! It is so easy to do what the Bible requires of us when pleasing the One we love is greater than the thrill of being pleased.

Second Corinthians 5:14 says, "For the love of Christ constraineth us; because we thus judge, that if one died for all, then were all dead." The love of Christ preoccupies me; it compels me; it makes me a prisoner of His love.

Father, please continue this marvelous work of love that You have begun within me. I would never have thought to request this kind of love on my own because I thought it was out of control and would make me vulnerable to abuse from others. I was so wrong. The truth is that Christ Jesus' love in me protects me from abuse. I have never been more in control than when I have chosen to ignore a wrong done to me. Psalm 119:165 (NIV) says, "Great peace have they who love your law, and nothing can make them stumble."

My days of offense are over because of Your deposit of love in me. Help me keep my dial tuned in to Your frequency so that the signal is not weak under attack.

Lust Will Make You Lose Your Footing

1 Timothy 6:6 (KJV)—But godliness with contentment is great gain.

od did not save us through the shed blood of Jesus Christ, His Son, for our focus to be on the world's wealth.

I used to think that my personal wealth was going to finance the furtherance of the kingdom. I have since discovered that God is going to fulfill His promise to humankind whether I have money to support it or not. He may use money, but He's not limited to material wealth.

Help me to appreciate the value of living a holy life in the midst of this corrupt and immoral world. re you in prison? Know that you are loved of God and special to Him. Consider this: He allowed you to be caught because the path you were on was leading to disappointment, depression, despair, destruction, and possibly death, and your temporary layover in prison can cause you to become productive.

Prisoners are in good company. Joseph, Jeremiah, John the Baptist, and Jesus were each in jail. The apostles Paul, Peter, and Silas were also prisoners with a purpose. Hebrews 11:7 (NKJV)—By faith Noah, being divinely warned of things not yet seen, moved with Godly fear, prepared an ark for the saving of his household, by which he condemned the world and became heir of the righteousness which is according to faith.

Toah had nothing to compare what God was saying to him in this warning. A boat this size was never built before. There had never been a gathering of animals like this before. Rain of this magnitude had never fallen before. All he had was faith. All he needed was faith.

Obedience Stabilizes Your House

Luke 6:46-47 (NKJV)—"But why do you call Me 'Lord, Lord,' and do not the things which I say? Whoever comes to Me, and hears My sayings and does them, I will show you whom he is like."

person obedient to God's Word builds his "house" having dug deep into the Word and laying a foundation that will take him back to the Word for the challenges life brings. And life brings them to all of us.

I was fortunate to learn early that obedience carries with it rewards and disobedience carries with it consequences. We often blame the devil for some things that happen to us when, in fact, it

is disobedience to what we know that creates the problems we have.

Luke 6:49 reads, "But he who heard and did nothing is like a man who built a house on the earth

without a foundation, against which the stream beat vehemently; and immediately it fell. And the ruin of the house was great."

I realize now that during the time of physical attacks on my husband's body the stability of our lives and ministry was demonstrated because we had laid a solid foundation in tranquil times. We did not just hear the words of Jesus, we did them. When the storm, flood, and stream arose, they were not a match for the foundation that we laid on the Rock, Christ Jesus. We had not allowed His words to be something superficial that tickled our ears. We dug deep in peacetime. It is a whole lot easier to dig when things are quiet than it is when they are vehemently beating against you.

Jesus is not impressed with us calling Him "Lord, Lord," then refusing to do what He teaches. He knows that He is our Lord when our lives show His teaching as the things around us fail and fall into a collapsed state. Years of experience have taught me not to expect to grow apart from having God's Word as my foundation.

Obedience stabilizes your house and prolongs your life. Why? God can use you and your obedience.

Provisions Come from the Provider

Hosea 7:14 (NKJV)—They did not cry out to Me with their heart when they wailed upon their beds.

ost of the desperation in our lives is allowed to move us closer to God. Instead, we often turn to others for help forgetting that God, and God alone, is our only source.

God may use people to relieve us, but they are never to be confused with God, our help. Thank God for every person He uses to aid us in getting us to where He wants us to be, but never allow the focus to be placed on them. Then when God moves them on or wants to use someone else we're not so attached that we cannot release them or so blind that we cannot see that He is including others to complete His work in us.

The same is true if you are the one being used of God. Never allow yourself to become so attached to anything or anyone God is trying to improve that you see yourself forever involved with them. We all have a season when God uses us concerning others and we need to know when that season is over.

Respect and honor should be to anyone that God uses to help us, just remember not to leave Him to follow them and all will be well. Our cry must always be to Him with our whole heart and He will always respond. He is the provider and our prayer to Him will be answered the closer we get to Him.

God is always interested in blessing the body of Christ. He wants to provide, extend mercy, show compassion, and direct us along a path that is lit to show us the stumbling blocks trying to prevent our progress. He is not going to remove the stumbling blocks and obstacles. He is going to provide His Word as the lamp to our feet, showing us His way.

God gave us the power to be led, not by our flesh, but by His Spirit. Fix, with God's help, what needs to be fixed in your life, but never pray for His provision then remove yourself from the provider.

Seed Sown Is Not Always Fruitful

Luke 8:5 (NKJV)—"A sower went out to sow his seed."

he God-given purpose of all seed is to be fruitful. It is to reproduce but it has to be sown first. Seeds are not to be hoarded or sown where they are in danger of being trampled, devoured, withered, or choked. Seeds need good, rich, moist soil to be fruitful.

The sower has the responsibility of knowing something about the soil prior to sowing his seed. Failure to get proper information can result in wasted seed, and this includes ministries. Seed that falls on rocks produce for the moment but will not produce lasting fruit. Fruit that benefits others provide additional seed for future reproduction.

Seed will grow in the midst of thorns. However, the thorns will continue to grow and eventually strangle perfectly good seed meant to produce.

According to Jesus the seed is the Word of God and will produce when properly used. However, anyone who hears the teachings of God's Word and does not seek for the understanding of what they heard is what we call "wayside" Christians. They hear it but do not know what it means.

The devil robs them quickly before they can believe it in their hearts and be positively affected by it. He knows that if you ever get an understanding of what God is saying to you in His Word, he, the devil, will have no further influence over you.

Spiritual immaturity is a sign of natural immaturity. Some Christians hear the Word of God, believe on it, and begin a fruitful life but they get waylaid along their journey because they become flesh-led instead of Spirit-led. Things happen in their lives that cause them to forget that Jesus is their burden bearer and they try to handle it themselves.

Testing helps to determine what you are all about and is not unique to a few Christians. God's Word was never intended to prevent stuff from coming. It was given to prepare you to better deal with it when it does come.

The Battle

Galatians 1:6 (NKJV)—I marvel that you are turning away so soon from Him who called you in the grace of Christ, to a different gospel.

here is a fierce and ongoing conflict between our lower nature, the flesh, and our recreated spirit. Our flesh has to be trained or retrained to follow the indwelling Spirit of God. Our lower nature is comfortable with sin and our recreated spirit is awaiting our submission to His control so that we can learn to walk in the Spirit pleasing to God.

We cannot kill the flesh because it is where we live. However, we can die to the flesh and its influence, and to its passion to satisfy what we want for the moment. The flesh cannot be satisfied for more than a moment before it drives you to look for something more. Big is never big enough, good is not good enough, and whatever we thought we needed to make us happy is always the

next thing or another person. It is Jesus alone that is our satisfaction.

When we became born again and with our mouth accepted Jesus as both Savior and Lord, we hooked up with the supernatural.

There is nothing more difficult for a Christian than to be still dabbling in sin. There just isn't a mix.

Our lives cannot be content with the weak, natural, or carnal things of the present age we live in whose dictator is satan.

Christians often speak of how hard it is to walk the Christian walk. I agree. It is hard if you accept the call without the commitment. There is nothing more difficult for a Christian than to be still dabbling in sin. There just isn't a mix.

The aim of sin is to destroy the move of the Spirit of God in His children that will provide life and life more abundantly. "I have come that they may have life, and that they may have it more abundantly" (John 10:10, NKJV). The battle in the spirit realm will always exist because as long as we are in the flesh we cannot please the Lord.

God will never allow you, as a Christian, to be happy or comfortable with sin, so give it up NOW.

The Immoral Woman

Proverbs 7:4-5 (NKJV)—Say to wisdom, "You are my sister," and call understanding your nearest kin, that they may keep you from the immoral woman, from the seductress who flatters with her words.

he devil could care less how many love affairs you get involved in or how much you allow yourself to be seduced with flattery so long as you refuse to accept that he is the "immoral woman," the liar whose words will prevent you from walking in the truth of God's promises to you.

The devil and his deceit can only be discerned by the wisdom of God in us. Calling understanding our nearest kin means simply that without understanding of the God-given wisdom in us our choices will be wrong and off.

How many wonderful, successful, educated people do you know who once served the Lord with zeal, but allowed themselves to listen to teaching and flattery that fed their egos, and today their lives are shipwrecked with some not even serving the Lord?

Repeating the words, "Wisdom, 'You are my sister and understanding, you are my nearest kin,'" keeps these forces stirred up in you so anything contrary to the Word of God and plan of God for your life will be rejected immediately.

There would not be a need to talk about the necessity for wisdom or understanding to keep us from immoral companions if women were the only immoral and flattering people in the world. Men often allow themselves to be used in this way. Satan influences both genders; therefore, God's Word is for both. God wants His wisdom and His understanding to influence both His male and His female offspring and the devil knows that. Both genders are to keep His Word and treasure His commands in us.

We get the best results when both male and female pay attention to His promises. When our fingers turn the pages of the Bible continually, to read, understand, and apply it, then our hearts, which are no longer made of stone, will find that each word is indelibly impressed and imprinted there to activate His wisdom and His understanding.

The Wisdom of God Is Better than Money from Man

1 Corinthians 2:4 (NKJV)—My speech and my preaching were not with persuasive words of human wisdom but in demonstration of the Spirit and of the power.

very evangelist, prophet, or prophetess that comes to town will use this verse to get you in position to receive when they lay hands on you. Some do receive, but what Paul is saying is that the demonstration of the Spirit and the power are in you taking God's wisdom, not man's, and applying it consistently to your life. When you do this, you can lay hands on yourself and your loved ones, and healing will take place.

The laying on of hands is scriptural and many receive healing, deliverance, or release. But they can only retain it when the wisdom of God's Word is their foundation.

When you recall the promises of God spoken and preached to you and you get relief and deliverance, God's Spirit and His power are at work and you become persuaded that it is His Word in you that gets the job done.

There are those in the ministry who want contracts signed before they agree to come to you. They want guaranteed monies and attendance or they won't come. This is not scriptural and eventually will cost them their anointing.

Money is needed and should be used to spread the Gospel and bring relief to the poor; it is never to be reserved and hoarded in the hands of those who teach and preach the Gospel.

Paul never charged or refused an opportunity to preach. In fact, it was the Holy Ghost who forbade him to go into certain places. What he did was teach the church their responsibility toward visiting preachers.

We, as spiritual leaders privileged to be anointed and called to preach, need to stop building empires that, it seems, can't trust the Lord to support. I am not suggesting we accept every invitation. I am suggesting we do not refuse to go where the Holy Spirit leads though not a penny may be given. Man has kept money intended for men. God has met every need of our ministry and personal lives.

Though They Saw My Work They Tested Me

Psalm 95:9 (NKJV)—When your fathers tested Me, they tried Me, though they saw My work.

t some point, God should not be required to prove Himself to us anymore. We threaten our own security and safety by refusing to believe God's promises to us.

The devil gets blamed or accused of a lot more than he is capable of doing. We give him too much credit for the activities of our lives.

God, not the devil, is ordering our steps because He is the only one with the plan for us to succeed. Don't find yourself in the enemy's territory because you followed your flesh and not your spirit. Refusing to follow the leading of the Holy Spirit is not the devil's choice, it is ours.

God was grieved forty years with the children of Israel. This means that He was disgusted with them because they would not accept the physical evidence of His love and faithfulness toward them. They were not required to live by faith as we are. They had the Red Sea experience, the manna in the wilderness, the Jericho wall to fall without a single person leaning against it. I could go on and on but you get the picture

How many times does your spouse have to prove his love or her love for you until you believe it?

God said, "It is a people who go astray in their hearts, and they do not know My ways" (Psalm 95:10, NKJV). He did not kill them but in His disgust He became angry and declared that they would not enter into His rest. (Psalm 95:11)

Entering God's rest means:

- He gives me sanity among the insane.
- He gives me sense in the midst of chaos.
- He gives me patience in the middle of anxiety.
- He gives me love among the unlovely and the evil.

Today, if you hear His voice, pay close attention, and purpose to perform. Do not allow rebellion and a desire to do your own thing cause the callus of disobedience to form a hard crust around your heart which is testing Him. The results are costly and deadly.

What Did I Say?

Proverbs 22:17-21

am Wisdom! Every word that I utter to you will make you wise when you listen intently to me. Because of my love and my plan for you there is no need to beg me to speak to you, you merely need to pay closer attention.

I am Spirit, therefore, I relate to you spirit to spirit. My voice is distinct from the voice of your flesh. Your body will take you in the opposite direction from where I want you to go.

Train your heart to hear my truth. You will find what I say to you agreeable and delightful.

Who's to Blame?

Proverbs 5:14 (NKJV)—"I was on the verge of total ruin, in the midst of the assembly and congregation."

ttending church faithfully is not a guarantee for victory, prosperity, or divine health, if you fail to adhere to and apply to your life the Word of God that you hear.

It is important to attend the assembly and fellowship with the congregation because they can be used by God to encourage you in your Christian walk. All of us need that. But anyone who does not adhere to the Word of God taught cannot succeed in spiritual matters because they are rejecting God's Word. One either rejects God and listens to the devil, or rejects the devil and listens to God. Those are your only options.

It is easy to blame the devil and others when we find ourselves in circumstances that are less than favorable. The truth is we are to blame for not choosing God and His best for us. It means giving up some things we thought we enjoyed. It means changing relationships and refusing to go places and looking at things our eyes should not be observing. Salvation is free but living the Christian life will cost you and, if you know what I know, you will gladly pay.

Like many of you, I had to come to the brink of disaster before I yielded to the promptings of the Lord. I was in the assembly and I fellowshipped with the congregation thinking that what I was doing would keep me safe from the enemy's influence.

I prided myself on being able to take care of myself and do for myself whatever I thought needed to be done. I was strong and intelligent and treated others as I wanted to be treated, but I was spiritually deformed and empty. I failed to apply the Word of God to my life that I had been taught.

You do not have to arrive at the verge of total ruin before making the right choice to serve the Lord. Today, say this with me, "Dear Lord, I am a sinner, please forgive me. Lord Jesus, come into my heart and live Your life through me. Amen."

You and Me, Lord

Hebrews 12:13 (KJV)—And make straight paths for your feet, lest that which is lame be turned out of the way; but let it rather be healed.

oes the path you are on sometimes seem barren? Stop looking for a crowd to join you on your journey. Jesus ministered to multitudes, as well as individuals. The Lord spoke to me one morning and said, "It is not so much the direction that you are going; it is being on the right path."

Your right path may take you in many directions, but it will always lead you to where you are supposed to go. There have always been those on assignment from God to do the unique and unusual. We never know if and when we are to step out into a path never before trodden. Safety is not in many numbers; it is two in one: God in you.

There is nothing worse than trying to include in your call someone who is not assigned. God has never needed crowds to fulfill His plan. John the Baptist was the only one on assignment to be the voice crying in the wilderness with the message "Prepare the way of the Lord; make His paths straight." Yes, Jesus worked with the disciples, but John was the only one assigned to get the ball rolling.

Most people would rather be echoes than a voice. However, moving forward with God may mean taking a different track than those around you do. Frances Roberts was divinely inspired to write, "Others may actually be going forward on the very path that would be for thee a retreat. They are not responsible to give me the kind of service I ask of thee."

To some, it would seem that you are in a rut. I pray that you are because this course of conduct is so superior to what the masses are doing. Please don't imitate what others are doing because it appears to be popular for the moment. For you it could be compromise. Never let the lack of a crowd sway you from the path that God has chosen for you. For you it is not lonely; it is simply uncrowded. Learn to be grateful to the Lord for helping you to see that at times it will simply be "You and me, Lord. You and me."

Salvation Through Faith in Jesus Christ

Galatians 3:26 (NLT)—So you are all children of God through faith in Christ Jesus.

ome teach that everyone is a child of God, period. They do not teach that the only way to the Father is through faith to receive Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior. Satan and the love of money have blinded them to the nonnegotiable Truth of God's Word and His plan of salvation.

In his letters to the brethren at the church in Ephesus, Paul says, "For this cause I bow my knees unto the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, of whom the whole family in heaven and earth is named" (Ephesians 3:14-15, KJV). This does not include unbelievers or the unsaved. The same is true of Ephesians 4:6, which says, "One God and Father of all, who is above all, and through all, and in you all." This is written to Christians and not to people who are unwilling to accept Jesus Christ of Nazareth as their Lord.

God "desires all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth" (1 Timothy 2:4, NKJV). "The Lord is not slack concerning His promise, as some count slackness, but is longsuffering toward us, not willing that any should perish but that all should come to repentance" (2 Peter 3:9 NKJV). This is the will of God, and it will never be different.

His will is to allow men, women, boys, and girls to make the choice. We must choose to be His children, or we must choose to be lost forever.

Whatever you do, tell everyone—especially those under the impression that all of humankind are children of God—that the only way is to accept His Son and to become His child by faith. We are all His creation, but we are not all in relationship with God as sons and daughters. The goodness of God leads us to repentance. Repentance is reversing your thinking and your deeds. Right now, make the choice to reverse any thinking that does not line up with the Word of God. Your eternal future depends on it.

Satisfaction Doesn't Cost A Dime

Genesis 43:1 (NLT)—But there was no relief from the terrible famine throughout the land.

ince money is no more than a medium of exchange, it has no value if what we need or desire is unavailable. When Israel sent his sons to Egypt the second time to purchase corn to eat (Genesis 43:2), he also asked them to tote double money in their hands, as well as the money previously returned to them on the last try (verse 12).

Israel's sons obviously were not lacking in funds. However, in a severe famine, money does not feed the hungry. In fact, in this story, Benjamin—not money—was the medium of exchange.

The weekly news usually tells how many millions of dollars new movies have brought in. I always smile and say, "Even in this 'slow' economy, people have this excess money to attend films."

No, the famine in our land is not for food. It is as Amos 8:11 (KJV) says: "Behold, the days come, saith the Lord God, that I will send a famine in the land, not a famine of bread, nor a thirst for water, but of hearing the words of the Lord."

Looking around, I see money everywhere. Awhile back, a cruise ship left New York harbor for a trip around the world. The minimum cost per person for the trip was \$25,000, and the maximum was \$375,000. While I would have enjoyed the trip, I longed more to tell the passengers on board that if they were not believers, they would still have a hunger for something when they returned—and His name was Jesus.

I live well, but it is not because of where I live. It is because of "Who" lives in me. The one who lives in me will go wherever we go.

I never have to run to and fro, seeking to satisfy the spiritual famine I once experienced. Money certainly did not satisfy what I needed, only Jesus did. God gave Him as a free gift to everyone who believes, and He is alive forever.

I still enjoy many creature comforts, but my famine was over when Jesus became my all in all. I simply sought first His kingdom and all of His righteousness, and I did not spend a dime to get Him.

Seek the Lord and See a Turnaround

2 Chronicles 33:12 (KJV)—And when he was in affliction, he besought the Lord his God, and humbled himself greatly before the God of his fathers.

anasseh was made king at the young age of twelve. He ruled for fifty-five years, but not in a manner that pleased God. Israel never would have gone into exile if Manasseh had listened to God, but he led the people to do more evil than did the pagan nations that God had destroyed (verse 9).

When the people in the Old Testament ignored God's warnings, God sent powerful enemies against them. In the New Testament, because of Jesus' intercessory prayer in John 17, He no longer sends enemies against us. We are the body of His Son, and He will never allow Jesus to be injured or wounded again.

Of course, when we willfully disobey, our faith to believe is not activated to appropriate the Lord's blessings and benefits. But our never-ending covenant with God always brings us back to Him.

Things changed for Manasseh when, in deep distress, he sought the Lord with a humble heart. God always hears prayers from humble hearts, and He will restore your losses so that you will know and realize that the Lord alone is God (2 Chronicles 33:12-13).

Don't see your profession or position as your achievement. God has given it to you. In order to maintain it, you must honor Him. Don't be a hardhead and refuse to heed God's warnings. He does not make requests. He commands us so that He can bless us.

Thank God, even though we mess up and ignore His words, His unfailing love will restore everything when we humble ourselves, pray, and acknowledge Him as the one and only.

Are you tired of counting your losses instead of your blessings? If so, then give due respect to the Almighty God. It doesn't matter how much you've blown it. What matters is that God loves you too much to let you succeed without Him.

Are you comparing your situation to others'? Don't look at the world's wealth. You don't see their tears and torment over trying to keep it.

If you are in deep distress, seek the Lord—and see a turnaround in your life.

Servants Stay With Their Master

John 12:26 (NKJV)—If anyone serves Me, let him follow Me; and where I am, there My servant will be also. If anyone serves Me, him My Father will honor.

n this verse, Jesus very clearly makes a promise that no one can revoke or prevent. However, it is conditional.

Yes, the Father honors anyone who serves the Son, but servants stay with their Master. Don't call yourself a servant of the Son if you spend all of your time attending to someone else's demands. A housekeeper does not show up for a paycheck at one home if she keeps another house.

Jesus said, "If anyone serves Me, let him follow Me; and where I am, there My servant will be also...." Jesus was essentially saying, "If you serve Me and you are where I am, then when I need you, I will not have to go looking for you to serve Me."

We need to ask ourselves this question: "Do I want the Father's honor?" If we answer "yes," then the next question is "Where am I spending my time? Am I serving a human who never seems to be satisfied, or are my efforts for Jesus uppermost in my thought life?"

My housekeeper does not wonder what I want done or the way I want it; she knows because I have specifically communicated these things to her. She does things exactly as I ask her to. In addition, she is willing to make changes as I request them.

Consequently, I not only pay her, but I also reward her above and beyond her salary. If I can do this as a human "master," how much more will God the Father reward anyone who serves His Son?

The "here and now" benefits I have received from the Father since committing to serve, follow, and be with His Son are almost more than I have room to contain. And the hope of the future reward is beyond my ability to fully comprehend. However, I don't serve His Son for the reward He promised. I serve His Son because He first loved me and taught me how to apply His love to others. Indeed, loving and serving others is one of the best ways to serve the Lord Jesus.

Human recognition and honor do not begin to compare with honor from the Father. Will you serve Him today?

Sincere Words Are Priceless

Jeremiah 15:19 (KJV)—Therefore thus saith the Lord, If thou return, then will I bring thee again, and thou shalt stand before me: and if thou take forth the precious from the vile, thou shalt be as my mouth: let them return unto thee; but return not thou unto them.

am occasionally amazed at the multi-millions of dollars people will spend on what is deemed rare.

He who has the most toys does not win. He who understands one's authority and the power of one's words wins.

God said to Israel, "Stop speaking with a forked tongue. Stop speaking faith and fear from the same mouth. Stop creating and destroying with your words."

The rare, the prized, and the valuable are not the things we possess; they are the words we speak and believe. The things we purchase or receive as gifts from humans may have a dollar value placed on them, but their value is subject to change.

Our spoken, faith-filled, sincere words are priceless. They are powerful and creative, and not one of them is without significance. This verse is telling us that we can only speak for God when we speak the rare, the prized, and the valuable words rather than those that shake in the wind. We cannot have morally loose, worthless words in our vocabulary.

In the parable of the prodigal son, Jesus said, "A certain man had two sons" (Luke 15:11). However, verse 24 reads, "For this my son was dead, and is alive again...." The world called him a prodigal because of his actions, but his Father never called him a prodigal. His dad called him *dead*, then he called him *alive*, but he never ceased to call him son.

When we speak what God has said, we are His children with the treasures and wealth of our Father. When we speak that which is wasteful, unfruitful, and causes to scatter, we are still His children but we lack understanding of what we say, which is without profit.

Father God, help me stay sensitive to what proceeds from my lips. I remove worthless, vile, and morally loose words from my vocabulary, for I am justified or condemned by the words of my mouth. Forgive me for all the words I have spoken that are contrary to Your written Word. I call them down now, in Jesus' name.

Spirit-Controlled Energies

Romans 8:9 (NLT)—But you are not controlled by your sinful nature. You are controlled by the Spirit if you have the Spirit of God living in you.

s believers, we are not to be driven by our human emotions, desires, and energies. We are to allow the Holy Spirit in us to control them.

Had I known and been taught the meaning of this verse as a child, I could have avoided a lot of garbage in my life. For me, accepting Jesus as a seven-year-old simply meant that I would go to heaven when I died. I had no immediate plans to die, so I thought I didn't need to be concerned about my new experience for some time to come.

No one told me that the new birth provided me with the power to resist temptation or to handle the challenges that life brings both the saved and the unsaved.

I'm not saying that anyone gave me a license to sin or do wrong. What happened was worse, in my opinion. The spiritual leaders I looked to for direction either did not know for themselves or were unable to put into practice the principles of being controlled by the Spirit.

Energy out of control is destructive. Credit card abuse, substance abuse, lingering lust, anger, fear, and even human love are all energies that must be submitted to the control of the Holy Spirit. No one can earn, inherit, or illegally gain enough money to pay for credit card abuse. Substance abusers can become murderers without ever intending to be so. Allowing lust to linger in your thoughts will result in action leading to death, unwanted pregnancy, or dissolved marital relationships. Anger out of control is like a speeding car with no brakes, driven by a blind person. Fear will cause you to hurt innocent people, as well as yourself. Love without limitation will create idol worship and stifling relationships; this kind of love turns people against God when the object of their affection is suddenly absent or removed in death.

My Father and my God, keep me mindful of Your Holy Spirit in me to help me stay balanced in the energies that each of us is presented with. You alone can be trusted with controlling my emotions. I release my unrestrained love only for You at all times, in Jesus' name.

Stop Robbing God

2 Chronicles 31:10 (NIV)—"Since the people began to bring their contributions to the temple of the Lord, we have had enough to eat and plenty to spare, because the Lord has blessed his people, and this great amount is left over."

t would be foolishness to walk up to me, stick a gun in my ribs, rob me, and then ask me to bless you. Yet people do this to God all the time.

Failure to give God His dime on every dollar (not just salary), is equivalent to robbing God. Lack in your life is not God's will, but unless you sow what already belongs to God, your harvest is blocked. The measure we sow is the measure we will reap.

God does not even extract our seed: He gives us seed to sow, then gives us bread to eat (2 Corinthians 9:10). Too many of

God's children are eating the seed along with the bread. Never eat your seed, especially the last of your seed. When God's children bring their contribution to the temple, these verses say there will be enough to eat with plenty—not

just a little, but plenty—to spare. Why? Because God blesses seed brought to the temples as well as the carrier of the seed, and He blesses them to such a degree that great amounts will be left over.

Join me today in a commitment to obey what God requires of His children. Then watch Him do what He loves to do: to manifest Himself to us in the form of continued blessings to us. Every good and perfect gift comes down from the Father above (James 1:17).

Make a decision to stop robbing God. Give Him His dime, and watch your ninety cents go further and last longer. It works, but it starts with a commitment. I encourage you to make that commitment today so you can cross the line of having enough and move over into a position of having plenty to spare.

Psalm 137:8 (NLT)—O Babylon, you will be destroyed. Happy is the one who pays you back for what you have done to us.

natural human reaction is to be appalled at inhumane acts against anyone; such acts go crosswise to our spirits. When these things happen, our pain is real and what we feel is not wrong. We must be sure, however, that when we call out to God for His will to be done, we leave the weapon of revenge to Him to wield.

A person may have been highly trained in the martial arts. Another person may have awards for being a sharp shooter. No one, however, has been trained by the Spirit of God to wield the weapon of vengeance.

God fulfilled the prophecy of Babylon's destruction because of His vengeance on behalf of His covenant people. However, Calvary and the shed blood of Jesus are the new prophecy that we are to experience.

I don't like violent acts and pain any more than anyone else, but I dislike hatred, bitterness, and anger even more. I don't believe I have the right to ask God to destroy anyone. I do believe, however, that I have the right to request His defense and protection.

How He defeats the work of the enemy is none of my business. I just know that He will make everything right. My prayer is for His grace and mercy to sustain me as I wait on Him to fix everything for me. We don't have to pray for the wicked to be punished; God has already promised that. He will be happy to pay the wicked back for what they have done to us. I am willing to be happy with what makes Him happy. He will do what is just for all concerned.

Thank God that we have not been given weapons of revenge to use against anyone. Unauthorized vengeance will cost us dearly. Just look at the conclusion of those who threw the three Hebrew boys in the furnace, and the final punishment of Daniel's enemies.

Put down any tool that is not going to dispense God's love, for it will ultimately destroy you also.

Habakkuk 2:3 (NLT)—But these things I plan won't happen right away. Slowly, steadily, surely, the time approaches when the vision will be fulfilled. If it seems slow, wait patiently, for it will surely take place. It will not be delayed.

To promise of God has ever been late. God has used this verse to stabilize me over the many years that I have had to exercise my faith for various things. I don't recall exercising my faith for personal things, but God has had to remind me of this verse for the work He has called me to.

You must be ready to receive it when it arrives. Wait. It will surely come, and it will not be behind time.

Stop watching the clock, the hands will appear to never move. Stop staring at the pot, a watched pot never boils. Focus your eyes on Jesus.

Remember where you were; then look at where you are. You are being positioned so smoothly that you are not aware of the gradual change that has already occurred. As you submit yourself to His schedule and patiently wait for the fulfillment of His plan, you will find that you are closer than when you first began. His promise to you will never be late. Wait.

Isaiah 2:17 (NIV)—The arrogance of man will be brought low and the pride of men humbled; the Lord alone will be exalted in that day.

an's arrogance allows him to get involved in superstition, divination, and idol worship (Isaiah 2:6), but it will not matter in the end. The Lord Almighty has a day in store for all who are proud, lofty, and self-exalted. He will arise to shake the whole earth, and anyone not anchored in Him through Jesus Christ and according to His Word will be humbled. Verse 20 says, "In that day men will throw away to the rodents and bats their idols of silver and idols of gold, which they made to worship."

You may live in a mansion, a castle, or a palace. You may drive a luxury vehicle or fly in your private jet—yet not realize that you are being driven, not by the light and Truth of God's Word, but by the desire for increasingly more. Yes, be willing to work, but what are you working for?

One thing worse than not knowing what you're working for is to have desires and be lazy. Proverbs 21:25 says, "The sluggard's craving will be the death of him, because his hands refuse to work."

The Day of the Lord is near, and God will require an accounting. Who and what are you trusting in? Isaiah 2:22 says, "Stop trusting in man, who has but a breath in his nostrils. Of what account is he?" Human beings are limited to the very breath in their nostrils. Everything being made today is subject to rust, corruption, decay, and destruction tomorrow.

Make a decision that this is the day of the Lord. He has made it, and we must rid ourselves of all things that hinder our walk with Him. Promotion comes from the Lord to those who humble themselves and trust in Him.

Withhold Nothing

Genesis 25:5 (KJV)—And Abraham gave all that he had unto Isaac.

hy did Abraham favor one son, Isaac, over the seven others he sired? Isaac was the child of promise, the covenant child. While the others were children of the flesh, God had spoken Isaac into existence and had confirmed His promise through the bodies of two people who, naturally speaking, could not produce a child.

God, in His mercy, blessed Abraham's firstborn son, Ishmael. He also provided gifts for the other six children. However, there was no mistake about which son was God's chosen one to fulfill His plan for humankind.

Today, we usually equally distribute our abundance among our children. This is certainly appropriate, unless they demonstrate disrespect for the God who provides us with the abundance.

Yet if we will watch closely, we will begin to see the ones being led by the Spirit of God. We will see that certain ones are operating in His wisdom and allowing God to establish their works as they commit all to Him.

Romans 8:32 says, "He that spared not his own Son, but delivered him up for us all." And 2 Peter 1:3 says that, along with His Son, God gave us "all things that pertain unto life and godliness."

As parents, we must choose how we will distribute these gifts. We need to link up with God so closely that we even write our wills according to God's perfect design. God knows what our loved ones will do with what He has blessed us with. His provision for us is not solely to benefit our individual families. God wants channels to work through to fulfill His plan for all of humankind, so seek His wisdom before signing a will. Then freely give as God designates, for He will anoint and multiply that which He has ordained!

Father, too often we make choices based on our emotions and not on Your leading within. You have provided absolutely foolproof and fail-proof assistance in our making choices through the person of the Holy Spirit. Forgive us for leaning to our own understanding. Teach us to be led by Your Spirit. It's not about favorites, partiality, or pressure from peers and family. It's about working with You so that we can please You and bring You glory, in Jesus' name.

Without Permission or Promise

Matthew 4:22 (KJV)—And they immediately left the ship and their father, and followed him.

hen Jesus told James and John to follow Him, He was truly testing their loyalty. Sons didn't just walk away from their fathers to go with anyone in those days. And the ship they sat in with their father represented their livelihood and their future. But there is nothing quite like hearing the voice of the Lord for yourself to cause you to make out-of-the-ordinary, culturally incorrect choices!

Notice that Jesus made no promise of what He would do for James and John. Neither did they ask their dad's permission to go. Likewise, there must come a point in your life that you take that step of faith, unconcerned about another's permission or promises.

No one can tell you when it is right to obey. You just know you can't do anything else until you have obeyed. That kind of obedience and trust draws you into the inner circle with Jesus. When God speaks, there are no alternatives.

In Genesis 12 we read that Abram, fearing Egyptians would kill him if they knew beautiful Sarai were his wife, asked her to tell the Egyptians she was his sister. Sarai didn't need to lie to save the man to whom God had already promised his best! Genesis 12:17 says the Lord plagued Pharaoh and his house because of Sarai. God already had a plan for what He would do if someone blessed or cursed Abram.

How quickly we, like Abram, forget! Look around you! Has God spoken a word to you? Are you following it, or is your emotional involvement influencing your choice and then are you justifying it in the name of the Lord?

Yes, you may appear cold and indifferent to others when you obey God, but that goes with the territory. Is it better to do it God's way or to lean to your own understanding?

God so looks forward to His children trusting Him beyond any doubt. Today, examine your choices. Have you held on to things and people that you were to leave behind? Don't try to rationalize your disobedience. God is not interested or impressed. Lying is the result of failing to follow God's message in the first place. Fix it before it's too late.

Worry Is Misdirected Energy

Matthew 6:34 (NLT)—"So don't worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will bring its own worries. Today's trouble is enough for today."

ears ago, when the Lord showed me that He would only give me daily bread as I requested it so I would establish a habit of coming to Him on a daily basis, He also told me that worry was misdirected energy.

Jesus said, "So, I tell you, don't worry about everyday life—whether you have enough food, drink, and clothes. Doesn't life consist of more than food and clothing?... Can all your worries add a single moment to your life? Of course not. And why worry about your clothes?... So don't worry about having enough food or drink or clothing" (verses 25,27,28,31).

The reason Jesus wants us worry-free is that worry is what the pagans and heathen do. They are deeply concerned about things (verse 32).

How should the children of God look at their needs? Jesus stated, "...Your heavenly Father already knows all your needs, and he will give you all you need from day to day if you live for him and make the Kingdom of God your primary concern" (verses 32-33).

Many times, the Lord has asked me to do some rather costly, unusual things for others; but He has always supplied what I needed to obey His command.

In the past, I have done things for others because they were nice things to do, but they were not God-ordained or Spirit-directed. What happened was that then I expected the recipients to be appreciative and grateful. I expected them to be there when I needed them. I expected God to honor my nice gesture. However, I discovered that He only supports what He authorizes. He multiplies the seed He tells me to sow. He meets my need from day to day if I live for Him and make His kingdom my primary concern.

I used to worry about many things that were not my business in the first place. Now I live for Him, teaching others about the profit in doing the same. God's kingdom is my primary concern, but I sure don't worry about it. One day I heard a wise friend say, "It is not my concern, even though it concerns me." I have been worry-free ever since.

Worsen the Devil's Worst Nightmare

John 10:10 (KJV)—The thief cometh not, but for to steal, and to kill, and to destroy: I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly.

ne day I was standing at my kitchen sink, meditating on a letter I had recently written for a book for college students, encouraging them to pursue their dream. As I stood there, the Holy Spirit spoke to me: "There is a level beyond that. Did you ever dream you would be doing what you are doing?" My response was, "Never for a moment."

Then He said, "There was a time when you had dreams and personal aspirations and you pursued them relentlessly and with a passion. But the time came when you began to set them aside, and so subtly you began to confer with Me daily, consecrating yourself for My use. You obeyed me as though you had no other option. You desired to do My will and bring pleasure to Me by obeying what I required you to do with and for others. The thief never ceased to come, but because of your obedience he was prevented from stealing from you. He was unable to kill your spouse or your children or to destroy what I had provided because of your faith. The seed you had sown and your absolute obedience to do things My way stopped him in his tracks toward you and yours. You became his worst nightmare. Once you found that he had been given more credit than he deserved, you looked for ways to demonstrate his defeat in your life. Now you are on a roll. You are deliberately pursuing what disturbs his tranquility and pleasure.

"Remember when, at five years old, you fell down a well? What about when the car you were riding in, along with two others, ended up on the grass in the traffic circle center because the driver was drunk? Of course you remember all of the opportunities the devil had to steal, kill, or destroy your life. His nightmare started when he found out that not only could he not have you, even when you were playing on his turf, but that you were now playing on God's turf. You were making it a lifestyle. Never keep this to yourself. Go tell everyone what the Lord has done for you, for doing so worsens the devil's worst nightmare."

You Don't Have to Beg for God's Attention

Psalm 145:18 (NLT)—The Lord is close to all who call on Him, yes, to all who call on Him sincerely.

am reassured to know how close God is to me when I need to call on Him. I have no concern about static on the line or the signal fading out in the middle of a sentence when I'm conversing with God. I know with certainty that I have His full and undivided attention when I "call on Him sincerely."

What does calling on Him sincerely mean? Instead of using the word "sincerely," *The King James Version* uses the word "truth," which is another way of saying "trustworthiness." When we call on God using His written and spoken promises, He hears Himself speaking. And we know He always listens to what He has to say because everything that He has spoken has come to pass or created a new thing.

When we refuse to look at what is in the natural to see what is in the spirit and we allow our faith to speak, God's attention is not only focused on what we are saying, but He is also prepared to call together all of Heaven to bring it to pass in the earth through us.

Don't just chit-chat with God. Say what you want based on what He has spoken to you, not only from His Holy Word, but also from His personal words to you that can be supported in His Word.

Today, stop for a moment to recognize that God is near. He is close to you and to me. He does not distance Himself based on our situations. We do not have to beg, squall, or grovel in the dirt to get God's attention. The attention deficit is our failing to speak forth His Truth, for when we do, God is aware that we are truly trusting in Him to bring a thing to pass.

Nothing moves God quite like our trusting Him. Quit holding back. Quit holding on to the little stuff you don't want to bother God with. To Him it is all little stuff. Get smart and roll the whole of your care on Him. (*All* of it.)

Why try to do it when God can and is willing to take care of everything that concerns you? God never tries anything. He does it—period.

You Don't Have to Sink

ne day my granddaughter, Sarah, fell out of a paddleboat we were in together. The Holy Spirit said, "Hold on to her." Since He knew that neither Sarah nor I could swim, and that I was taking 241 people to Israel two days later, I obeyed. We went well below the surface and rose immediately. I knew enough to not struggle. Having learned to float, I thought I could get Sarah to safety by floating until she got help. Thank God, His right hand of mercy got me to a boulder and literally fastened me there until I obtained enough breath to help God help me up.

Through that experience, I learned a great lesson. When your faith does not allow you to walk on the water of your situation and life has not taught you to swim, never resort to struggling in the waters of life; you might sink. Instead, fill yourself so full of His promises in your time of fellowship with Him that when the flood comes in, it will not drown you. In fact, to your surprise, you will find that God's faith-filled words will cause you to float. Most people can float longer than they can swim anyway; it certainly takes less effort.

Did that recent telephone call or unexpected letter nearly send you into a tailspin? Don't struggle with it. Listen on the inside of you. If you have filled yourself up with God's Word, you will hear your message of how to float. Help is on the way.

If you have not been in the presence of God consistently through His Word, stop what you are doing right now, ask for forgiveness for spiritual neglect, and plead for direction, wisdom, and strategy to purposefully seek Him first on a daily basis.

Did you say, "I don't have time"? Rethink that. You don't have the time not to. The waters are rising and a dam is about to burst. You may not be able to prevent the flood, but you don't have to sink from struggling either.

Gear up for some Holy Ghost swimming lessons, or at least take some courses on the fine art of faith floating. It is preparation time. Get on with it, and avoid the struggle.

Do it anyway; they'll get over it. Besides, they need the unique gift of God's grace that you are called to express.
